### **Bible Study Pathways**

#### Lesson 9

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#### A Story to Ponder...

A slave named Joe was being sold at a slave auction to a new master. As the auction price for him escalated higher and higher, he set his jaw in defiance. One man, though poor in appearance, continued to outbid all the others and finally Joe was sold to this highest bidder. As his sellers dragged him away with a chain around his neck, rather like an animal, Joe was surprised to hear his new master command them to remove the chains. They protested that he would run away, but his new master was firm and the chains were removed. The new owner told him, "I bought you to set you free." He then took him to a little house and told him, "This house is for you. You can marry and have a family if you like. I will give you food from my own table. My house is right over there." Not surprisingly, Joe decided he wanted to work for this man-- not out of fear, or even hope of reward, but out of thankfulness and love. Today, we may follow God's commandments, out of love for him because he bought us with the price of his Son to set us free.

Which commandment did God specifically say to Remember?

The fourth commandment is like God's seal; it reminds us that he is the Creator and the rightful owner of this world. The Sabbath had its origin in Eden, being made on the seventh day of Creation week. God rested on that day, blessed it, and sanctified it—setting it apart for holy and sacred use.

But pray ye that your flight be not in the winter, neither on the sabbath day: Matt. 24:20. (Isaiah 66:22, 23; Malachi 3:6, Rev. 14:12)

The Bible lets us know without a shadow of a doubt that the commandments of God and the Sabbath will forever be kept by God's people. Matthew 24 shows that Jesus anticipated that the Sabbath would continue to be observed following his ascension and during the end of time. It will also be kept in the new Earth.

Daniel 7:25 warns us of a kingdom represented by the little horn of the fourth

Where did Sunday worship originate?

"Sunday is a Catholic institution, and its claims to observance can be defended only on Catholic principles. . . . From beginning to end of Scripture there is not a single passage that warrants the transfer of weekly public worship from the last day of the week to the first."

Colossians 2:8 says, Beware lest any man spoil you through philosophy and vain deceit, after the tradition of men, after the rudiments of the world, and not after Christ. (Acts 5:29)

"Of course, the Catholic Church claims that the change was her act;... And the act is a MARK of her ecclesiastical power and authority in religious matters." Cardinal Gibbons, letter dated July 7, 1895.

- The Sabbath is a gift from God and the true Lord's Day. (Mark 2:27,28) It may be used for kind deeds to others. (Matt. 12:12)
- The Sabbath begins at sundown Friday night and continues until sundown Sabbath. (Lev. 23:32, Gen. 15, 1:8, etc.)
- On the preparation day (Friday) we should complete all our work as biblically directed. (Ex. 16:23, Luke 23:54-56)
- On Sabbath we should refrain from buying and selling and all other common labor. (Neh. 13:15-21, Deut. 5:12-14)

God promises a blessing on His special day if we refrain from secular pursuits. "If thou turn away thy foot from the sabbath, from doing thy pleasure on my holy day; and call the sabbath a delight, the holy of the LORD, honourable; and shalt honour him, not doing thine own ways, nor finding thine own pleasure, nor speaking thine own words: Then shalt thou delight thyself in the LORD; and I will cause thee to ride upon the high places of the earth, and feed thee with the heritage of Jacob thy father: for the mouth of the LORD hath spoken it." Isaiah 58:13,14

### <u>CONCLUSION</u>

With not a shred of biblical evidence for the observance of Sunday, and multiple Bible texts supporting the Seventh day Sabbath-Saturday, we then have a choice to make. Do we follow the traditions of man or obey God's law, accept God's gift to us and REMEMBER the seventh-day Sabbath?
