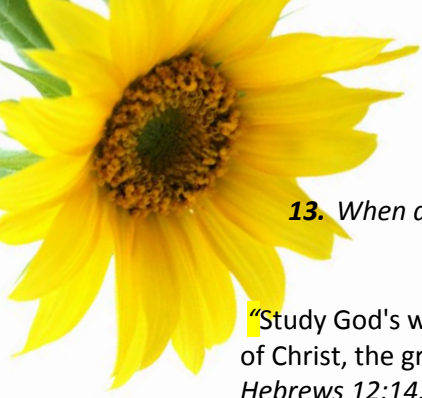


Memory Verses: Psalms 139:23-24; 1 Timothy 1:15; Hebrews 3:7-8

“You who in heart long for something better than this world can give, recognize this longing as the voice of God to your soul. Ask Him to give you repentance, to reveal Christ to you in His infinite love, in His perfect purity. In the Saviour's life the principles of God's law--love to God and man--were perfectly exemplified. Benevolence, unselfish love, was the life of His soul. It is as we behold Him, as the light from our Saviour falls upon us, that we see the sinfulness of our own hearts.” – **Steps to Christ, Page 28**

**Webster's 1828 Dictionary – In Public Domain*

Benumbing – Benum

To make torpid; to deprive of sensation; as, a hand or foot benumbed by cold.

To stupify; to render inactive; as, to benum the senses.

Deprav(e)-ing

To make bad or worse; to impair good qualities; to make bad qualities worse; to vitiate; to corrupt; as, to deprave manners, morals, government, laws; to deprave the heart, mind, will, understanding, taste, principles

Indulge[d]

To permit to be or to continue; to suffer; not to restrain or oppose; as, to indulge sloth; to indulge the passions; to indulge pride, selfishness or inclinations.

...not to check or restrain the will, appetite or desire;...

Procrastination

A putting off to a future time; delay;

Submission

The act of submitting; the act of yielding to power or authority; surrender of the person and power to the control or government of another.

Obedience; compliance with the commands or laws of a superior.

...a yielding of one's will to the will or appointment of a superior without murmuring.



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
