INSERT FOR LESSON #13, ANTITYPICAL SANCTUARY CLEANSED

Living in the Antitypical Day of Atonement—What does that mean for me?

1 Corinthians 10:11 Now all these things happened unto them for ensamples: and they are written for our admonition, upon whom the ends of the world are come. (1 Pet. 1:12)

The sanctuary services in Bible times were given as ______ for us.

The anti-type of the Day of Atonement in the earthly sanctuary points to when God begins to go through the records in heaven and to cleanse the heavenly sanctuary. There is also a duty for the people.

Daniel 8:13,14 Then I heard one saint speaking, and another saint said unto that certain saint which spake, How long shall be the vision concerning the *daily* sacrifice, and the transgression of desolation, to give both <u>the sanctuary</u> and <u>the host</u> to be trodden under foot? And he said unto me, Unto two thousand and three hundred days; then shall the sanctuary be cleansed.

What four things does the Bible list as the duty

of the people on the day of Atonement?

Lev 16:29,30 And this shall be a statute for ever unto you: that in the seventh month, on the tenth day of the month, ye shall afflict your souls, and do no work at all, whether it be one



of your own country, or a stranger that sojourneth among you: <u>For on that</u> <u>day shall the priest make an atonement for you, to cleanse you, that ye may</u> be clean from all your sins before the LORD.

Lev 23:27 Also on the tenth day of this seventh month there shall be a day of atonement: it shall be an holy convocation unto you; and ye shall afflict your souls, and offer an offering made by fire unto the LORD.

Remember in the anti-type of the Day of Atonement the application will be spiritual just as the physical lamb represented the Jesus, the spiritual Lamb of God. (I Corinthians 15:46, John 1:29, I Cor. 10:1-4)

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What does the physical offering made by fire (sacrifice) represent spiritually?

I Peter 2:5 "Ye also, as lively stones, are built up a spiritual house, an holy priesthood, to offer up spiritual sacrifices, acceptable to God by Jesus Christ." (Romans 12:1,2; Heb. 13:15; Psalm 51:17)

What does the physical "no work at all" and the "holy convocation" represent

spiritually? (1 Cor. 10:31,33; Matt. 6:33,24; John 4:34, ---Hebrews 10:25; Matt. 18:20)

What does "afflict your souls" mean we are supposed to do?_

Ezra 8:21 Then I proclaimed a fast there, at the river of Ahava, that we might afflict ourselves before our God, to seek of him a right way for us, and for our little ones, and for all our substance. (Also Isaiah 58:5, 6, 7 & the rest of chapter 58, Acts 3:19)

In the typical service, while the high priest was making the atonement for Israel, all were required to afflict their souls by repentance of sin, by humiliation before the Lord, lest they be cut off from among the people. In like manner, all who would have their names retained in the book of life, should now, in the few remaining days of their probation, afflict their souls before God by sorrow for sin, and true repentance.

⁹ Lev. 16:30 says that on the Day of Atonement "shall the priest make an

atonement for you, to cleanse you, that ye may be clean from all your sins before the LORD." According to Lev. 16:13-16, 34 and Heb. 9:7 what part did the high priest take in the Day of Atonement?

Heb. 9:7 But into the second went the high priest alone once every year, not without blood, which he offered for himself, and for the errors of the people:

What did the blood that was sprinkled on the mercy seat represent and what does it

mean to us?

Eph. 1:7 In whom we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of sins, according to the riches of his grace; (Also Col. 1:14) 1 Peter 1:18,19 Forasmuch as ye know that ye were not redeemed with corruptible things.... But with the precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot:

The mercy seat is linked to God's judgment seat because this is where He appeared in a cloud. Heb. 4:16 Let us therefore come boldly unto the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy, and find grace to help in time of need.
