South-of-the-Border Black Bean Salad

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| 1 can (15 oz, 425 g) black beans, rinsed | 1 can (15 oz, 425 g) corn, drained |
| 1 orange bell pepper, chopped | 1/3 cup green onions, sliced |
| 1 Tbsp olive oil | 1/2 tsp cumin |
| 1 tsp garlic powder | 2 Tbsp cilantro |
| 1/2 tsp salt, or to taste | 1 pint homemade salsa |
- Mix together all except salsa. Chill. Add salsa immediately before serving.



Red Salsa

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|---|----------------------------|
| 3 large garlic cloves, pressed | 1 medium onion |
| 1/2 cup cilantro [coriander] leaves | 1 tsp organic sugar |
| 2 cans (15 oz, 425 g) whole tomatoes, drained | 1 Tbsp lime juice |
| Salt, to taste | Pinch of cayenne, optional |

Process until lightly chopped, but not until soupy. You may also add a bit of bell pepper or green onions. If you would like to can this, bring to boil and simmer 10 minutes. Ladle into prepared jars and leave 1/4 inch head space. Process 15 minutes in a hot water bath canner (10 minutes in a pressure cooker); this is for pint jars. This recipe makes approx. 3 cups.

PROFITABLE TRADITIONS

Cultivate Kindness – *"And whosoever shall give to drink unto one of these little ones a cup of cold water... verily I say unto you, he shall in no wise lose his reward."* Matt. 10:42 There is more to this "cup of cold water" than appears on the surface. Patrick Henry's Will

"I have now disposed of my property to my family. There is one thing that I wish I could give them and that is faith in Jesus Christ. If they had that and I had not given them one shilling, they would have been rich: and if they had not that, and I had given them all the world, they would be poor indeed."

A converted Hindu gave the following address to a number of his fellow countrymen: *"I am, by birth, of an insignificant and contemptible caste—so low, that if a Brahmin should chance to touch me, he must go and bathe in the Ganges for the purpose of purification; and yet God has been pleased to call me, not merely to the knowledge of the Gospel, but to the high office of teaching it to others. My friends, do you know the reason of God's conduct? "For ye see your calling, brethren, how that not many wise men after the flesh, not many mighty, not many noble, are called: But God hath chosen the foolish things of the world to confound the wise; and God hath chosen the weak things of the world to confound the things which are mighty; And base things of the world, and things which are despised, hath God chosen, yea, and things which are not, to bring to nought things that are: That no flesh should glory in his presence." 1 Corinthians 1:26-29

This is the lesson that God sought to teach Elijah after his "blazing" Mount Carmel experience followed by Jezebel's threat on Elijah's life. I Kings 19:11,12 records, *"And he [God] said, Go forth, and stand upon the mount before the LORD. And, behold, the LORD passed by, and a great and strong wind rent the mountains, and brake in pieces the rocks before the LORD; but the LORD was not in the wind: and after the wind an earthquake; but the LORD was not in the earthquake: And after the earthquake a fire; but the LORD was not in the fire: and after the fire a still small voice."*



"Not in mighty manifestations of divine power, but by 'a still small voice,' did God choose to reveal Himself to His servant. He desired to teach Elijah that it is not always the work that makes the greatest demonstration that is most successful in accomplishing His purpose. While Elijah waited for the revelation of the Lord, a tempest rolled, the lightnings flashed, and a devouring fire swept by; but God was not in all this. Then there came a still, small voice, and the prophet covered his head before the presence of the Lord... He now knew that a quiet trust, a firm reliance on God, would ever find for him a present help in time of need."

"It is not always the most learned presentation of God's truth that convicts and converts the soul. Not by eloquence or logic are men's hearts reached, but by the sweet influences of the Holy Spirit, which operate quietly yet surely in transforming and developing character. It is the still, small voice of the Spirit of God that has power to change the heart." {Prophets and Kings, pg. 168, 169}

Although both Moody and Spurgeon are considered great evangelists, they both testified that one of their most successful sermons was the "worst" one, where their tongue got tangled so bad that they felt it a failure. Spurgeon actually kept tabs as best he could and was able to trace 41 conversions to the tongue-tied sermon! Moody's was equally successful. The power is in the word of God, not the instrument. *"...This is the word of the LORD...Not by might, nor by power, but by my spirit, saith the LORD of hosts." Zechariah 4:6*

This reminds me of the story of a missionary who was scheduled to preach to a large crowd in Australia, when he lost his voice. He stated: *"What can you do with a missionary who has no voice? We had come to the last night of the [evangelistic campaign]... A group...gathered around me, and I asked them to pray as Paul did, that this thorn in the flesh might be taken from me. But we went on to pray that if it pleased God to keep me in weakness, I would rejoice in my infirmities in order that the power of Christ might rest upon me. As it turned out, I had to get within one inch of the microphone just to croak the gospel. I was unable to use any inflection of voice to express my personality. It was just a croak in a monotone, and all the time we were crying to God that his power would be demonstrated in human weakness. Well, I can honestly say that there was a far greater response that night than any other night. I've been back to Australia ten times now, and on every occasion somebody has come up to me and said, 'Do you remember that night when you lost your voice? I was converted that night.'"*

Indeed, *"The kingdom of God comes not with outward show. It comes through the gentleness of the inspiration of His word, through the inward working of His Spirit, the fellowship of the soul with Him who is its life. The greatest manifestation of its power is seen in human nature brought to the perfection of the character of Christ." {Ministry of Healing, pg. 36}*

God's *"grace is sufficient"* for us, because His *"strength is made perfect in weakness."* Therefore, the Christian may safely conclude, *"Most gladly therefore will I rather glory in my infirmities, that the power of Christ may rest upon me." 2 Corinthians 12:9*




Prophetic News Notes -- Beware

“And he [Jesus] charged them, saying, Take heed, beware of the leaven of the Pharisees, and of the leaven of Herod.” Mark 8:15 The name Herod comes from the same root as our word hero and heroic. Thus, this admonition to beware of the leaven of Herod could be in one sense warning against the leaven of hero worship. Indeed, the story recorded for us in the book of Acts chronicles that one of the Herods indeed allowed the crowd to go over the line in their “hero worship” of him. That Herod paid dearly for it. “And upon a set day Herod, arrayed in royal apparel, sat upon his throne, and made an oration unto them. And the people gave a shout, saying, It is the voice of a god, and not of a man. And immediately the angel of the Lord smote him, because he gave not God the glory: and he was eaten of worms, and gave up the ghost.” Acts 12:21-23

Although I do not participate in political questions, a similar dangerous trend is emerging that the watchman on the walls must warn against. Again, a mere man is being made into a god. What is perhaps most unbelievable and unsettling to me is that this trend is not limited to America where Donald Trump served as president. I have seen similar signs in other foreign countries. Although I was unable to track down all the pictures I have seen, Trump has been advertised as “the way”, “the truth,” “savior,” etc.* Fox news headlined “Pastor criticizes now-removed Fort Oglethorpe billboard comparing Trump to Jesus.”¹ The billboard quoted Romans 8:17 adding the words “Joint Heirs.”



The ad for a book on Amazon states that “It speaks about End Time Prophecies and Biblical revelations regarding ‘President Donald J. Trump, the Son of Man. The Christ.’”² There have also been dreams and visions reported among evangelicals about this man. Yet ,when I once saw Trump questioned concerning basic Christian topics, like whether he asks God for forgiveness for his sins, his answer in short was “I don’t think so...I don’t bring God into that picture.”



While Trump has undeniable charisma, it might be of interest to note what spiritualists and Luciferians teach of their “christ.” A former New Ager revealed, “The Alice Bailey teachings say that the Christ of the New Age will **not** be a specifically Christian person, but rather a figure having the qualities of a politician, sociologist, and transreligious spiritual leader.”³

Quite a few months ago, a friend of mine, who was at the time exposing other spiritualistic teachings, told me that in their research they found (to their surprise) that the spiritualists were all backing Trump. Recently, someone shared with me a video quote from a channeler that shows this trend continues.

The channeler says they receive messages or Q-drops from the “Q” of QAnon. The channeler stated that Trump is the archangel Uriel (meaning “flame of God”). She also states that among others “Christians... have been duped and lied to...” and we need a

“consolidation and a convergence of all the belief systems coming together...”⁵ A link with Uriel could conceivably partially accomplish this. Because according to Wikipedia “Uriel” has connecting links with Anglican and Orthodox tradition, Esoteric, Kabbalistic, and Gnostic teachings, as well as links with quite a few movies, video games and that which is mythological, supernatural and paranormal.

Quite a broad popularity. Obviously, we cannot believe all that spiritualists have to say, since they work for “the father of lies,” (although sometimes they have acknowledged truth to discredit it as in Acts 16:16-18). But nevertheless the Christian should be wary of that which Satan and his spiritualists strongly support.

While we recognize that God is the final judge of character and motive, we should rely on and heed the word of God that warns, “Let no man beguile you of your reward in a voluntary humility and worshipping of angels, intruding into those things which he hath not seen, vainly puffed up by his fleshly mind, And not holding the Head [Jesus Christ], from which all the body by joints and bands having nourishment ministered, and knit together, increaseth with the increase of God.” Colossians 2:18,19



Medical knowledge. Physicians must be experts in established and new biomedical, clinical, and cognate sciences and how to apply this knowledge to patient care.

Practice-based learning and improvement. Physicians must always investigate and evaluate their own care and look for ways to improve.

Interpersonal and communication skills. Physicians must be able to communicate effectively with patients, their families, and other health professionals."

“Ordering, giving, and interpreting diagnostic tests”




