

Now that you have an understanding of **How** to study the Bible and how the <u>Bible</u> explains and interprets itself, we can focus on various parts of the Bible. This book will begin our focus on the **Parables** of Jesus.

It is very important to understand the "Parables" because they contain the "Doctrines" and "Truths" that Jesus felt were the most important for us to understand.

As we study the "Parables" and discover their Doctrines and Truths, remember they are **not** the teachings of any church, but rather the teachings of Jesus Himself!

INTRODUCTION TO:

The **Parables** of JESUS

How did **JESUS** communicate **TRUTH** to his listeners?

Matt. 13:34 "All these things spake Jesus unto the multitude in parables: and without a parable spake He not to them."

35 "That it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the prophet, saying I will open my mouth in **parables**; I will utter things which have been **kept secret** from the foundation of the world."

Mark 4:33 "And with many such parables spake He the Word unto them, as they were able to hear it."

34 "But without a parable spake He not unto them; and when they were alone He expounded all things to His disciples."

Conclusion:

Thus Jesus used "Parables" to communicate truth ("the Word") to His listeners. The above texts also tell us that Jesus always <u>used parables</u> to teach the people,

(" without a parable spake He not.")

Why did JESUS speak in Parables?

Mark 4:2 "And He taught them many things by Parables, and said unto them in His doctrine."

Matt.13:10 "And the disciples came and said unto Him, Why speakest thou unto them in parables"?

11 "He answered and said unto them, Because it is given unto you to know the mysteries of the kingdom of heaven, but to them it is not given."

Conclusion:

Jesus spoke in **Parables** to teach "**doctrine**" to His followers and to teach the "**mysteries**" of the kingdom of heaven that had been **kept secret** from the foundation of the world". Matt. 13:35

How did JESUS "Open the Understanding" of *Parables* to his Disciples?

Mark 4:10 "And when He was alone, they that were about Him with the twelve asked of Him the parable." Mark 4:13 "And He said into them, know ye not this parable? And how then will ye know all parables?"

The disciples did **not understand** the "Parable of the Sower" that Jesus gave in Mark 4:3-8. Jesus told them that **if** they could understand **that parable**, then they could understand **all parables**. Then, Jesus proceeded to show them **how** to understand that parable (Mark 4:14-20) so that they **could understand all parables**.

THE PARABLE OF THE SOWER (EXPLAINED BY JESUS)

"A sower went out to sow his seed:" **Luke 8:5** Luke 8:11 "Now the parable is this: "The **seed** is the **Word** of God." "The sower soweth the Word." Mark 4:14 "And as he sowed, some (seed) fell by the **Luke 8:5** wavside": "Those by the wayside are they that hear"; Luke 8:12 Mark 4:15 "And these are they by the wayside, where the word is sown": "but when they have heard, Satan cometh Mark 4:15 immediately and taketh away the Word that was sown in their hearts".

Matt.13:19 "When anyone heareth the Word of the kingdom, and understandeth it not, then cometh the wicked one, and catcheth away that which was sown in his heart. This is he which received seed by the wayside."

Conclusions:

- 1. The **seed** represents the **Word** of God (Bible)
- 2. The sower represents someone teaching the Word (Bible)
- 3. Those by the wayside represent those that hear the Word (Bible) but don't understand it.
- 4. The word (Bible) was "sown" in their hearts.
- 5. The devil takes away the Word out of their hearts, lest they should believe and be saved.

Jesus "opened the understanding" of the <u>parable</u> to his disciples, by applying a Spiritual meaning to each of the <u>real objects</u> in the parable. Since Jesus implied that if you can <u>understand</u> this <u>parable</u>, you can understand all <u>parables</u>, He was teaching the <u>principles</u> for understanding all <u>parables</u>.

"The Sower"

(Identifying the Saved and the Lost)

"<u>The Sower</u>" (Matthew 13:3-9, 18-23)

Matt. 13:3 And he spake many things unto them in parables, saying, Behold, a sower went forth to sow;

- 4 And when he sowed, some seeds fell by the wayside and the fowls came and devoured them up:
- 5 Some fell upon stony places where they had not much earth: and forthwith they sprung up, because they had no deepness of earth:
- 6 And when the sun was up they were scorched; and because they had no root, they withered away.
- 7 And some fell among thorns; and the thorns sprung up, and choked them:
- 8 But other fell into good ground, and brought forth fruit, some an hundredfold, some sixtyfold, some thirtyfold.
- 9 Who hath ears to hear, let him hear.

We will begin our study of this parable by searching the Bible to see if there are any *similar parables* which might <u>help us</u> understand this parable. Using <u>Strong's Concordance</u> and the word "sower" we find that in Mark 4:3-9, 14-20 and in Luke 8:5-8, 11-15 there are *similar parables*. In order to see the <u>similarities</u> and also the <u>differences</u> between the parables, we will use the method that is suggested by the Bible when trying to understand complex passages of Scripture.

Habakkuk 2:2 And the Lord answered me, and said, Write the vision, and <u>make it plain</u> upon **tables**, that he may run that readeth it.

By using a **table** we can easily see the **similarities** and the <u>differences</u> between the parables.

THE PARABLE OF THE SOWER (EXPLAINED)

BIBLE VERSES	JESUS' EXPLANATION
Luke 8: 5 5 A sower went out to sow his seed: and as he sowed, some fell by the way side; and it was trodden down, and the fowls of the air devoured it.	Luke 8: 11, 12 11 Now the parable is this: The seed is the word of God. 12 Those by the way side are they that hear; then cometh the devil, and taketh away the word out of their hearts, lest they should believe and be saved.
Matthew 13: 3, 4 3 And he spake many things unto them in parables, saying, Behold, a sower went forth to sow; 4 And when he sowed, some seeds fell by the way side, and the fowls came and devoured them up.	Matthew 13: 18, 19 18 Hear ye therefore the parable of the sower. 19 When any one heareth the word of the kingdom, and understandeth it not, then cometh the wicked one, and catcheth away that which was sown in his heart. This is he which received seed by the way side.
Mark 4: 3, 4 3 Hearken, Behold, there went out a sower to sow. 4 And it came to pass, as he sowed, some fell by the way side, and the fowls of the air came and devoured it up.	Mark 4: 14, 15 14 The sower soweth the word. 15 And these are they by the way side, where the word is sown; but when they have heard, Satan cometh immediately, and taketh away the word that was sown in their hearts.

<u>Identifying</u> the **Spiritual** Meanings of: the **Real Objects**:

1. The **seed** is the Word of God.

(Luke 8:11)

2. The Sower "sows" or teaches the Word.

(Mark 4:14)

3. The **wayside** is a <u>place</u> where the Word is heard. (Mark 4:15)

4. The **wayside hearer** is a <u>person</u> who does **not** understand the Word.

(Matthew 13:19)

5. The **seed "trodden down"** is the <u>Word</u>, being mistreated or <u>changed</u> by men.

(Luke 8:5; Jeremiah 12:10; Ezk. 34:18, 19)

6. The **fowls** that devoured the seed are **people** (Prov. 6:5) used by **Satan** to **remove** the Word or **truth** that the person <u>hears</u> from their heart lest they should **believe it** and be <u>saved</u>.

Paraphrase:

A teacher (sower) went out to teach (sow) the Word (seed); and as he taught (sowed) the Word, (seed) it was heard (fell) by people who did not understand it (wayside hearers). The Word (seed) was mistreated and changed by men (trodden down). Then Satan used people (fowls) to remove the Word or truth from the hearts of those that heard the truth, lest they should believe it and be saved. (fowls devoured the seed)

BIBLE VERSES	JESUS' EXPLANATION
Luke 8: 6 6 And some fell upon a rock; and as soon as it was sprung up, it withered away, because it lacked moisture.	Luke 8: 13 13 They on the rock are they, which, when they hear, receive the word with joy; and these have no root, which for a while believe, and in time of temptation fall away.
Matthew 13: 5, 6 5 Some fell upon stony places, where they had not much earth: and forthwith they sprung up, because they had no deepness of earth: 6 And when the sun was up, they were scorched; and because they had no root, they withered away.	Matthew 13: 20, 21 20 But he that received the seed into stony places, the same is he that heareth the word, and anon with joy receiveth it; 21 Yet hath he not root in himself, but dureth for a while: for when tribulation or persecution ariseth because of the word, by and by he is offended.
Mark 4: 5, 6 5 And some fell on stony ground, where it had not much earth; and immediately it sprang up, because it had no depth of earth: 6 But when the sun was up, it was scorched; and because it had no root, it withered away.	Mark 4: 16, 17 16 And these are they likewise which are sown on stony ground; who, when they have heard the word, immediately receive it with gladness; 17 And have no root in themselves, and so endure but for a time: afterward, when affliction or persecution ariseth for the word's sake, immediately they are offended.

Identifying the Spiritual Meanings of the Real Objects:

1. The type of **place** where the <u>seed falls</u> represents the *condition* of the **heart** of a person.

good ground--soft, converted heart (Luke 8:15) stony ground--hard, unconverted heart (Ezekiel 11:19)

(no depth of ground-no softness of earth) (Mark 4:5)

- 2. The root of the <u>seed</u> represents the <u>person's</u> relationship with Jesus. (Col. 2:6, 7) To have no root <u>in himself</u> means to have no relationship with Jesus.
- 3. The moisture that the <u>seed</u> lacked represents the Holy Spirit. (Isa. 44:3) The seed without moisture represents a <u>person</u> who does not have the Holy Spirit in <u>his heart</u>.
- 4. The <u>seed</u> that was **scorched** when the **sun was up** (Matt. 13:6), represents a <u>person</u> who **believes** <u>for a while</u> (Luke 8:13), but when **persecution** or **tribulation** arises because of **the Word** (Matt. 13:21), they <u>fall away</u> (Luke 8:13).

Paraphrase:

The Word (seed) was also heard (fell on) by people with hard unconverted hearts (stony ground). These people believed for awhile, but when persecution and tribulation came because of the Word (sun was up), they could not endure and fell away (scorched), because they did not have the Holy Spirit (lacked moisture) and they had no relationship with Jesus (no root).

BIBLE VERSES	JESUS' EXPLANATION
Luke 8: 7 7 And some fell among thorns; and the thorns sprang up with it, and choked it.	Luke 8: 14 14 And that which fell among thorns are they, which, when they have heard, go forth, and are choked with cares and riches and pleasures of this life, and bring no fruit to perfection.
Matthew 13: 7 7 And some fell among thorns; and the thorns sprung up, and choked them:	Matthew 13: 22 22 He also that received seed among the thorns is he that heareth the word; and the care of this world, and the deceitfulness of riches, choke the word, and he becometh unfruitful.
Mark 4: 7 7 And some fell among thorns, and the thorns grew up, and choked it, and it yielded no fruit.	Mark 4: 18,19 18 And these are they which are sown among thorns; such as hear the word, 19 And the cares of this world, and the deceitfulness of riches, and the lusts of other things entering in, choke the word, and it becometh unfruitful.

<u>Identifying</u> the **Spiritual** Meanings of the **Real Objects**:

- 1. The **thorns** represent the <u>cares</u>, and <u>riches</u>, and <u>pleasures</u> and <u>lusts of other things</u> of the world. (Luke 8:14; Mark 4:19)
- 2. These things (thorns) choke the <u>Word</u> (Mark 4:19) or "crowd it out" so that there is **no time** for **Bible Study** (the Word).
- 3. As a result the *seed* cannot grow properly and so no "fruit" or <u>Christian Virtues</u> (Gal. 5:22) or Converts (Prov. 11:30) are produced.

Paraphrase:

The Word (seed) was also <u>heard</u> (fell among) by people who <u>allowed themselves</u> to become <u>so involved</u> with the cares and riches and pleasures and the lusts of other things of the world (thorns), that they had no time for Bible Study (choked the Word). As a <u>result</u>, these people did not <u>mature</u> in the Christian Virtues and they had no converts (fruit) to give to the Lord.

BIBLE VERSES	JESUS' EXPLANATION
Luke 8: 8 8 And other fell on good ground, and sprang up, and bare fruit an hundredfold. And when he had said these things, he cried, He that hath ears to hear, let him hear.	Luke 8: 15 15 But that on the good ground are they, which in an honest and good heart, having heard the word, keep it, and bring forth fruit with patience.
Matthew 13: 8,9 8 But other fell into good ground, and brought forth fruit, some an hundredfold, some sixtyfold, some thirtyfold. 9 Who hath ears to hear, let him hear.	Matthew 13: 23 23 But he that received seed into the good ground is he that heareth the word, and understandeth it; which also beareth fruit, and bringeth forth, some an hundredfold, some sixty, some thirty.
Mark 4: 8,9 8 And other fell on good ground, and did yield fruit that sprang up and increased; and brought forth, some thirty, and some sixty, and some an hundred; 9 And he said unto them, He that hath ears to hear, let him hear.	Mark 4: 20 20 And these are they which are sown on good ground; and bring forth fruit, some thirtyfold, some sixty, and some an hundred.

<u>Identifying</u> the **Spiritual** Meanings of: the **Real Objects**:

- 1. The *good* ground represents the **soft heart** of a **Converted** Christian. (Luke 8:15; Ezk. 11:19)
- 2. The <u>seed</u> received into the *good* ground represents a Converted <u>person</u> who studies (hears) (Rom. 10:17) and understands the Word. (Matt. 13:23)
- 3. The fruit <u>produced</u> represents the Christian Virtues and Converts won for the Lord. (Gal. 5:22; Prov. 11:30)
- 4. There will be some Converted Christians who produce more fruit than others, but all Converted Christians will be saved.
- 5. Those who have been converted will be honest and have good hearts. (Luke 8:15) When they hear the Word, they will keep it and with patience will mature in Christian Virtues and win many Converts for the Lord. (Luke 8:15)

Paraphrase:

The Word (seed) was also heard (fell on) by people with soft, converted hearts (good ground) who understood the Word and kept the Word with patience. As a result, these people matured in the Christian Virtues and with patience won many converts for the Lord. Some won more converts than others.

Doctrinal Truths (Taught by **Jesus** in the Parable of "The Sower")

- 1. The Word of truth will be <u>heard</u> by <u>everyone</u>.
- 2. **Jesus** grouped <u>everyone</u> in the world into <u>4 groups</u> of people.
- 3. Group 1: Consists of people who hear the Word but do not understand it. They have been deceived by men who have "changed the Word" and by people who "remove the Word" from their hearts when they have found the truth! These people will be lost!
- 4. Group 2: Consists of people who have <u>heard</u> the <u>Word</u> and **believed** it, but who have **never allowed** the **Lord** or the **Holy Spirit** to "soften" and **convert** their hard hearts!

When persecution and tribulation come because of the Word, these people cannot endure because they do not have the Holy Spirit and they do not have a Relationship with Jesus. These people will be lost!

5. Group 3: Consists of people who have <u>allowed</u> themselves to become so involved with the cares, riches, pleasures and lusts of the world, that they have no time for the study of God's Word. As a result, these people will not mature in the Christian Virtues and they will have no converts to give to the Lord. These people will be lost!

- 6. Group 4: Consists of people who have "heard" or studied the Word and understand it. They have allowed the Holy Spirit to come into their hearts and they have a Relationship with Jesus. As a result, their hearts are soft and they have been converted. They are honest and when the Word tells them to do something "they do it"! They have developed patience and have acquired the Virtues of a Mature Christian. By their life and by the Word they have won many converts for the Lord. These people will be saved!
- 7. The main teachings of this parable are as follows:
 - 1. Everyone will hear the Word of truth.
 - 2. We must **not** allow **Pastors** or <u>teachers</u> who have "<u>changed the Word</u>" to **deceive** us.
 - 3. We must **not** allow **friends** or others to "remove" the **truth** of the Word <u>from us</u> after we have <u>heard it!</u>
 - 4. We must do our <u>very best</u> to **understand** the **Word** for ourselves.
 - 5. We **must** allow the <u>Holy Spirit</u> to come into our <u>heart</u> and *convert us* and give us a **soft heart**.
 - 6. We must develop a relationship with Jesus.
 - 7. We must **expect persecution** and **tribulation** as Christians "because of the Word" but with the help of **Jesus** and the Holy Spirit we can endure!

- 8. We must make time for the study of God's Word. We must not allow the cares, riches, pleasures and lusts of other things to "crowd out" our time with the Word.
- 9. We will **not** be able to <u>mature</u> in the <u>Christian</u> **virtues**, nor will we be able to bring <u>any</u> **converts** to the Lord **unless** we *spend time* in **Bible Study** (the Word).
- 10. Everyone will be given an <u>opportunity</u> to "hear" or <u>learn</u> the *TRUTH* (Word), but **not everyone** will listen or be **saved!**
- 11. When we read the **Word** and it tells us to "do something" we need to **do it!**

"Treasure Hid in a Field"

(Searching for **Hidden Treasure** in the Bible)

"Treasure Hid in a Field" (Matthew 13:44)

Matthew 13:44 "Again, the kingdom of heaven is like unto treasure hid in a field; the which when a man hath found, he hideth, and for joy thereof goeth and selleth all that he hath, and buyeth that field."

Comments:

This parable describes someone who has found something of the greatest value! He is willing to give up everything in order to obtain it! Instead of being "sorrowful" because he has to "give up everything", the man is filled with joy at the thought of what he will gain!

<u>Identifying</u> the **Spiritual** meaning of the Parable:

In order to discover the **Spiritual meaning** of this parable, we will first have to discover the **Spiritual meaning** of the <u>real objects</u> used in the parable. The real objects are: *field*, *treasure*, and *man*.

Now we will use the Concordance and <u>compare</u> <u>Scripture</u>.

Comparing Scripture:

Field – first meaning

Acts 1:18 "...this man <u>purchased</u> (redeemed) a field with the reward of iniquity..."

Rom. 6:23 "The wages (reward) of sin (iniquity) is death..."

Acts 1:19 "That field is called ... the field of blood."

Matt. 13:38 "The field is the world."

Rev. 5:9 "...thou wast slain, and hast <u>redeemed</u> (purchased) us to God by thy **blood** out of <u>every</u> kindred, and tongue, and people, and nation."

Comment:

Thus, the **field** represents the **world** that was <u>redeemed</u> by the **blood** of Jesus.

Field - second meaning

Prov. 2:3-5 Yea, if thou criest after **knowledge**, and liftest up thy voice for **understanding**; If thou seekest her as silver, and searchest for her as for **hid treasures**; Then shalt thou **understand** the fear of the LORD, and **find** the **knowledge of God**.

Comment:

The <u>only place</u> that we can "search" for the **hid treasure** of the *knowledge of God* is in **God's Word**. Thus, the "<u>field</u>" represents the **Bible** or God's Word.

Conclusions:

The Spiritual "field" represents:

- 1. The world (redeemed by the blood of Jesus)
- 2. The **Bible** or God's Word

Treasure

Exodus 19:5 "Now therefore, if ye will obey my voice indeed, and keep my covenant, then **ye** shall be a peculiar **treasure** unto me above all people: for <u>all the earth</u> is mine:"

Prov. 2:4,5 "If thou seekest ... as for hid treasures; Then shalt thou understand ... and find the knowledge of God."

Col. 1:26, 27 "Even the mystery which hath been hid from ages and from generations ... which is Christ in you, the hope of glory."

2 Cor. 4:3,4 "But if our gospel be hid, it is hid to them that are <u>lost</u>: in whom the god of this world hath blinded the minds of them which believe not, lest the light of the glorious gospel of Christ, who is the image of God, should shine unto them."

Conclusions:

The spiritual "treasure" represents:

- 1. God's people
- 2. The Gospel of Christ and the knowledge of God

Comment:

The "treasure" was hidden in the field. It did not <u>lie on the surface</u> of the ground, but was buried beneath the surface. To obtain the "treasure" required the "work" of digging. Similarly, to obtain the knowledge of God and the understanding of the Gospel, requires the "work" of digging or searching the Scriptures.

Man

Mark 15:39 "And when the centurion, which stood over against him, saw that he so cried out, and gave up the ghost, he said, Truly this man was the Son of God."

John 9:11 "He answered and said, A man that is called Jesus made clay, and anointed mine eyes, ..."

Matthew 4:4 "But he answered and said, It is written, **Man** shall not live by bread alone, but by <u>every word</u> that proceedeth out of the <u>mouth of God</u>."

Conclusions:

The Spiritual "man" represents:

- 1. Jesus
- 2. A person who "lives by God's Words" (Christian)

Comments:

It is clear from our study of the **Spiritual meanings** of the <u>real objects</u> in the parable, that <u>each object</u> has a double or <u>two</u> **Spiritual meanings**. This implies that there are <u>two distinct</u> **meanings** for the parable. If we substitute each of the meanings into the parable and the <u>context</u> of the parable <u>supports</u> the meaning, then there are **two meanings** to the parable.

Spiritual Meaning 1 (Paraphrase)

Matthew 13:44 Again, the kingdom of heaven is like God's people (treasure) hidden in the world (field); which when Jesus (man) discovered, with joy gave up everything he had (sold all) in heaven and came to this world (field) and with his blood, redeemed (bought) this world (field).

Spiritual Meaning 2 (Paraphrase)

Matthew 13:44 Again, the kingdom of heaven is like the Gospel of Christ and the knowledge of God (treasure) that is hidden in God's Word (field); which when a man discovers, with joy gives his heart completely to Jesus (sells all) so that he can obtain (buy) salvation and the understanding and knowledge of God (treasure) that is hidden in the Bible (field).

Summary:

The parable of the "Treasure hid in a field" has been shown to definitely have two **Spiritual meanings**:

- Jesus "giving up everything" in <u>heaven</u> to redeem us, His <u>treasure!</u>
- 2. Christians willing to "give up everything" in this world to obtain a relationship with Jesus and a knowledge of His Word, our treasure!

Matthew 6:19-21

"Lay <u>not</u> up for yourselves <u>treasures upon earth</u>, where moth and rust doth corrupt, and where thieves break through and steal: But <u>lay up</u> for yourselves <u>treasures in heaven</u>, where neither moth nor rust doth corrupt, and where thieves do not break through nor steal: For where your **treasure** is, there will your **heart** be also."

Comment:

To "give up your **treasure**" upon *earth* and to "lay up your **treasure**" in *heaven*, means to "turn your **heart**" from the things of this <u>world</u> and to "give your **heart**" to Jesus and the things of <u>heaven</u>.

<u>Doctrinal Truth</u> (Taught by **Jesus** in the Parable of "Treasure hid in a field")

- 1. There is a "**treasure**" that is <u>worth</u> "giving up everything" to obtain.
- 2. For <u>Jesus</u>, the "treasure" is a **person** that **loves Him completely!**
- 3. For <u>human beings</u>, the "treasure" is **Salvation** and **Eternal life** and a **knowledge of God!**
- 4. In order for <u>Jesus</u> to obtain His "treasure" (us) nothing was <u>withheld</u>. The price of the "treasure" was so high that it required Him to "give up" heaven and even to "give up" His life!

- 5. In order for <u>us</u> to obtain our "treasure" (Salvation and a knowledge of God), **nothing** must be <u>withheld</u>. The **price** of "treasure" is so high (it required Jesus' death) that it requires us to give our **heart completely** to Jesus.
- 6. In order for us to <u>obtain</u> the **treasure**, "digging" will be required of us. <u>Digging</u> represents the "work" of **searching the Scriptures** to obtain a **knowledge of God** and of the <u>Gospel</u>.
- 7. When the "treasure" is <u>obtained</u>, it will bring **joy** into our lives!

"The One Pearl of Great Price"

(Jesus gave Everything For Us)

"The One Pearl of Great Price" (Matthew 13:45, 46)

Matthew 13:45, 46 "Again, the kingdom of heaven is like unto a merchant man, seeking goodly pearls: Who, when he had found one pearl of great price, went and sold all that he had, and bought it."

Comments:

There are no similar parables from which we could get help in understanding this parable. We will have to look at the real objects in the parable and try to find other Bible texts using these objects in order to learn more about why Jesus used them in this parable.

Identifying the Real Objects:

- Merchant man, pearls, pearl (of great price)
 The actions in the parable are:
 - Seeking, finding, selling, and buying

Comparing Scripture:

Pearl

Matthew 13:45 "...found one pearl of great price."

Revelation 21:21 "And the twelve gates were twelve pearls: every <u>several* gate</u> was of one **pearl**: and the street of the city [*New Jerusalem*] was pure gold..."

^{*} several - Greek #303 - each

Comments:

These <u>two texts</u> are the <u>only texts</u> in the Bible using the word "**pearl**". There are other texts using "**pearls**" which we will look at later.

Matthew 13:45 tells us that the **one pearl** was of *great* price or very valuable.

Revelation 21:21 tells us that each of the gates of the Holy City is of one pearl.

Conclusions:

- 1. There is one Pearl more valuable than any other.
- 2. The **only way** to enter into the <u>Holy City</u> is through the gate of **one Pearl**.
- 3. The use of the word "one" in both texts is significant. The Bible is stressing the point that **this Pearl** is different from all other pearls.
- 4. The word "gate" or "gates" in the Greek (# $4440 \pi \upsilon \lambda \omega \upsilon$) means "gate-way" or "door-way". Thus the word "door" could be used instead of the word "gate". The addition of the word "way" to the words "door" or "gate" also seems to be significant.
- 5. Jesus said in John 10:9 "I am the door: by me if any man enter in, he shall be saved..." And John 10:1 says, "He that entereth not by the door... the same is a thief and a robber."
- 6. Jesus said in John 14:6 "I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me."
- 7. If we put what the <u>Bible teaches</u> in John 10:9 and John 14:6 together, Jesus was saying, I am the "door-way". Jesus also made it very plain that the only way to "enter in" or be saved was through Him.

Thus the Bible evidence all points to Jesus being the one Pearl of great price!

Now we will look at the word "pearls".

Pearls

Job 28:12,13 "But where shall **wisdom** be found? and where is the place of <u>understanding</u>? Man knoweth not the <u>price</u> thereof; neither is it found in the land of the living."

Vs. 18 "No mention shall be made of coral, or of **pearls**: for the price of **wisdom** is above rubies."

Vs. 20,21 "Whence then cometh wisdom? and where is the place of <u>understanding</u>? Seeing it is hid from the eyes of all living..."

Vs. 23 "God <u>understandeth</u> the way thereof, and he knoweth the place thereof."

Matthew 7:6 "Give not that which is <u>holy</u> unto the dogs, neither cast ye your **pearls** before swine..."

Matthew 13:45 "...a merchant man, seeking goodly pearls"

Conclusion:

"Pearls" represent the valuable "hidden" wisdom or truths of God that are <u>only found</u> by "seeking" or searching the Scriptures.

Merchant Man Matthew 13:45 "Again, the kingdom of heaven is like unto a merchant man, seeking goodly pearls."

When we substitute the Spiritual meaning for "pearls" into this text and paraphrase it, it says:

Paraphrase: ...a merchant man seeking the "hidden wisdom" or truths (goodly pearls) found only by searching the Scriptures.

Thus, the "merchant man" represents a person who is searching the Scriptures to find the truth!

A "merchant man" is someone who "buys and sells".

Prov. 23:23 "Buy the truth, and sell it not; also wisdom, and instruction, and understanding."

Isaiah 55:1 "...he that hath <u>no money</u>; come ye, buy, and eat; yea, come, buy wine [doctrine] and milk [gospel] without money and without price."

Conclusion:

The "merchant man" who "buys" represents someone who "without money" can obtain the truth if he will search the Scriptures.

Sold (sell) all

Acts 2:44,45 "And <u>all that believed</u> were together, and had all things common; and **sold** their **possessions** and goods, and parted them to all men, as every man had need."

Matthew 19:16 "And, behold, one came and said unto him, Good Master, what good thing shall I do, that I may have eternal life?"

Vs. 21,22 "Jesus said unto him, If thou wilt be perfect, go and sell that thou hast, and give to the poor, and thou shalt have <u>treasure in heaven</u>: and come and follow me. But when the young man heard that saying, he went away sorrowful: for he had <u>great possessions</u>."

Vs. 27-29 "Then answered Peter and said unto him, Behold, we have forsaken all, and followed thee; what shall we have therefore? And Jesus said unto them, ... Every one that hath forsaken houses, or brethren, or sisters, or father, or mother, or wife, or children, or lands, for my name's sake, shall receive an hundredfold, and shall inherit everlasting life."

Comments:

The "believers" mentioned in Acts 2:44,45 had literally "sold their possessions" and had distributed the money to those who had need.

The <u>disciples</u> (like Peter) had also "**forsaken all**" for the Lord. The "rich young man" that came to Jesus had "<u>great possessions</u>" which he was not willing to sell in order to "have **treasure** in <u>heaven</u>".

Jesus said in Matthew 6:19-21,

"Lay <u>not</u> up for yourselves treasures upon earth...
But <u>lay up</u> for yourselves treasures in heaven... For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also."

This shows that what Jesus is **really** interested in is the condition of the **heart**, not the possessions! **Many** of the Bible characters, like Abraham and Job, were **very rich** men! Yet, their hearts were **totally** focused on the Lord and they put **Him first** in their lives. In other words, they were **converted** in their **hearts** and they had "no other gods before God" (Exodus 20:3).

Jesus said in **Matthew** 6:33, "But seek ye first the kingdom of **God**, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you."

Jesus wants us to put **Him first** in <u>our lives</u>, **above** all our <u>possessions</u>. Then He has promised that He will <u>give us</u> the "possessions" that we need. He is not against "possessions", except when they are placed in **the heart** above **Him!**

Conclusion:

Thus, to "sell all that you have" spiritually means to "withhold nothing from the Lord" or to be willing to do anything He says! This is what true Conversion of the heart means!

In the past many people have had to <u>leave their homes</u> or <u>loved ones</u> or "give up" something in order to follow the Lord. Today the Lord expects no less from us! If we are to be saved we must put Jesus and "following Him" above all else! This "price" which we must "pay" is small indeed when compared to the price that Jesus paid for us when he died on the Cross to <u>save us!</u>

Phil. 2:5-8 "Let this mind be in you, which was also in Christ Jesus: Who, being in the form of God, thought it not robbery to be equal with God: But made himself of no reputation, and took upon him the form of a servant, and was made in the likeness of men: And being found in fashion as a man, he humbled himself, and became obedient unto death, even the death of the cross."

John 15:13 "Greater love hath no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends."

Summary (meaning 1)

- 1. The "one Pearl" (of great price) represents Jesus.
- 2. The "pearls" represent the "hidden" truths of God that are found only by "seeking" or searching the Scriptures.
- 3. The "merchant man" who is "seeking pearls" represents a person who is searching the Scriptures to find truth.
- 4. The <u>finding</u> of the "one Pearl" of <u>Great Price</u> by the "merchant man" represents a person "finding" **Jesus** as **his Savior** as he <u>searches the Scriptures</u>.
- 5. The selling of "all that he had" by the "merchantman", represents a person making the decision to put Jesus first in his life, withholding nothing from Him, and being willing to "follow Him completely" and do whatever He says! This is true conversion.

Comments:

Before we complete our study we need to <u>explore the</u> <u>possibility</u> of this parable having a <u>double significance</u> or a **second** meaning. (Recall that we discovered the parable of the "treasure hid in a field" had a **second** meaning."

Comparing Scripture

Pearls

Job 28:16-18 "It cannot be valued with the gold of Ophir, with the precious onyx, or the sapphire. The gold and the crystal cannot equal it: and the exchange of it shall not be for jewels of fine gold. No mention shall be made of coral, or of pearls: for the price of wisdom is above rubies."

The above text clearly shows that "pearls" are considered to be "jewels" by the Bible. Let us see what the Bible says that spiritual "jewels" represent so that we will know what the second meaning for pearls is.

Malachi 3:17 "And they shall be mine, saith the LORD of hosts, in that day when I make up my jewels; and I will spare them, as a man spareth his own son that serveth him."

Thus, the Bible says:

- 1. A pearl is a jewel. (Job 28:16-18)
- 2. A jewel is a person. (Mal. 3:17)
- 3. A pearl = a jewel = a person

So the pearls in the parable represent people.

Merchant Man (seeking goodly pearls) In the parable the "merchant man" was seeking "pearls". If we substitute the Spiritual meaning of "pearls" = people into the parable and paraphrase it: Paraphrase: (Matthew 13:45) Again the kingdom of heaven is like a merchant man, seeking goodly people (pearls): who when he hath found one person (pearl) of great price, went and sold all that he had, and bought him (it). Thus, the **merchant** man was **seeking** goodly* **people**. * goodly --#2573 καλως – well, fully well. #2570 καλος – good, honest, virtuous Seeking (seek) Luke 19:10 "For the Son of man is come to seek and to save that which was lost." Matthew 18:11-14 "For the Son of man is come to save that which was **lost**. How think ye? if a man have an hundred sheep, and one of them be gone astray, doth he not leave the ninety and nine, and goeth into the mountains, and seeketh that which is gone astray? ... Even so it is not the will of your Father which is in heaven, that one of these little ones should perish." Thus, seeking is associated with Jesus "seeking" to save even one lost person (sheep)

Summary (meaning 2)

- 1. The Bible says that a *pearl* is a "jewel".
- 2. A spiritual "jewel" represents a person.
- 3. Thus, "pearls" or "jewels" in the parable represent people.
- 4. The **one** "pearl" (of great price) in the parable represents **one person** (greatly loved).
- 5. The "merchant man" represents Jesus.
- 6. The "merchant man" seeking goodly <u>pearls</u> represents Jesus (merchant man) seeking to save **people** (goodly pearls).
- 7. The one pearl of great price that the "merchant man" sold all that he had and bought represents the value of one lost person to Jesus! He paid a great price (He died on the Cross) to redeem (buy) even one person.

John 15:13 "Greater love hath no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends."

Doctrinal Truth (Taught by **Jesus** in the Parable of "The one Pearl of Great Price")

- 1. There are valuable **truths** (pearls) in the <u>Bible</u> that are found only by **searching the Scriptures**.
- 2. These valuable **truths** (pearls) are **hidden** from the surface seeker.
- 3. When a person "searches the Scriptures" and finds **Jesus** as his **Savior**, he has found the "Pearl of Great Price"!
- 4. When a person <u>makes</u> the decision to put Jesus first in his life, <u>withholding nothing</u> from Him, and willing to "do whatever He says", he has "sold all that he has"! This person is truly converted.
- 5. People (pearls) are like valuable jewels to God.
- 6. Even one person is extremely valued by God.
- 7. **Jesus** came to earth **seeking** to **save** people (goodly jewels) who were **lost** in their **sins**.
- 8. Jesus paid a Great Price (died on the cross) to redeem (buy) them.
- 9. **Jesus** "gave up everything" (sold all) to **save people**, because of His **love**.

The Parable Of:

"The Old and New Wine Bottles"

(The Importance of Conversion)

The Parable of:

"The Old and New Wine Bottles" (Matthew 9:17)

17 Neither do men put new wine into old bottles: else the bottles break, and the wine runneth out, and the bottles perish: but they put new wine into new bottles, and both are preserved.

We will begin our study of this parable by searching the Bible to see if there are any <u>similar parables</u> which might help us understand this parable.

Using Strong's Concordance and the word "bottles" we find that in Mark 2: 22 and in Luke 5: 37-39 there are similar parables.

Mark 2:22 And no man putteth new wine into old bottles, else the new wine doth burst the bottles, and the wine is spilled, and the bottles will be marred: but new wine must be put in new bottles.

This <u>similar</u> parable uses the word "marred" instead of "perish" when referring to the bottles. This may be of some help to us later as we study the parable in detail.

Luke 5:37-39 And no man putteth new wine into old bottles; else the new wine will burst the bottles, and be spilled, and the bottles shall perish.

38 But new wine must be put into new bottles; and both are preserved.

39 No man also having drunk old wine straightway desireth new: for he saith, the old is better.

This similar parable adds the thought that "no one who has drunk old wine immediately (#2112 Straightway) desires the <u>new wine</u> because he thinks the <u>old wine</u> is better". This thought may help us later as we study the parable in detail. **Comments:** This parable discusses two types of "wine" (old and new) and two types of "bottles" (old and new) The parable points out that the type of container (bottle) that "wine" is placed in is very important and that the container (bottle) must be new in order to preserve both the "wine" and the "bottle". An old "bottle" cannot contain the new "wine". A new "bottle" must be obtained to contain the new "wine". Now that we understand the <u>Physical</u> part of the parable, it is time to discover the Spiritual meaning of the parable. We have already identified the Real Objects in the parable as: bottles, old bottles, new bottles, wine, old wine, new wine Now we need to discover their Spiritual meanings by using the Concordance, or the Bible Word Pictures reference booklet. We will start by looking up the word "wine".

Discovering the Spiritual Meaning of: "Wine"

Proverbs 20:1

"Wine is a mocker, strong drink is raging: and whosoever is deceived thereby is not wise."

Conclusion: "Wine" represents something that causes someone to be deceived.

Isaiah 28:7

"But they also have erred through wine, and through strong drink are out of the way; the priest and prophet have erred through strong drink..."

> Conclusion: "Wine" represents something that causes someone to err or leave the right way.

Deuteronomy 32:33

"Their wine is the *poison of* dragons, and the cruel venom of asps."

Revelation 12: 9

"And the great dragon was cast out, that old serpent, called the Devil, and Satan which deceived the whole world."

Conclusion: "Wine" represents something that Satan uses to deceive people.

Habakkuk 2:5

"Yea also, because he **transgresseth** by **wine**."

<u>Conclusion:</u> "Wine" represents something that

<u>causes</u> a person to **transgress or sin**.

Final Conclusion: "Old Wine" or "strong drink" must represent False Doctrine.

Since "Old" Wine represents False Doctrine then, "New" Wine must represent True Doctrine.

Discovering the Spiritual meaning of: "Bottle"

Psalms 119:53

"For I am become like a bottle"

Jeremiah 19:10

"Then shalt thou break this **bottle**... so will I break this **people**.

Conclusion: "Bottle" represents a person.

Jeremiah 19:1

"Thus saith the Lord, go and get a potters earthen bottle...

Jeremiah 18:3, 4, 6

"Then I went down to the potters house... and the vessel he made of clay was marred... so he <u>made it again</u> another <u>vessel</u>... saith the Lord, behold as the clay is in the potters hand so are ye in mine hand..."

Conclusion: "New" bottle represents a person made "new" by the Lord. A "new" bottle represents a "converted" person.

The "marred" bottle or "old" bottle must then represent an "unconverted" person.

Discovering the Spiritual meaning of: "Drink" or "Eat"

Song of Solomon 8:2

"I would <u>lead thee</u> and bring thee into my mother's house, who would **instruct**... I would cause thee to **drink**...

Jeremiah 15:16

"Thy words were found and I did eat them: and thy word was unto me the joy and rejoicing of mine heart."

Conclusion: "Drink" or "Eat" means to receive instruction or be taught or gain knowledge.

To summarize the Spiritual meaning of the Real Objects:

Wine represents Doctrine

"Old" Wine represents "False" <u>Doctrine</u> "New" Wine represents "True" <u>Doctrine</u>

Bottle represents a person

"Old" **Bottle** represents "unconverted" <u>person</u>
"New" **Bottle** represents "converted" <u>person</u>

To "Drink" or "Eat" means to be taught or to gain knowledge.

Now we are ready to <u>substitute</u> the <u>Spiritual meaning</u> of these <u>real objects</u> back into the parable and to <u>paraphrase</u> it.

Bible verse: Luke 5:37-39

- 37 "And no man putteth new wine into old bottles; else the new wine will burst the bottles, and be spilled, and the bottles shall perish."
- 38 "But the **new wine** must be put into **new bottles**; and both are preserved."
- 39 "No man also having **drunk old wine** straightway desireth **new**; for he saith, the old is better."

Paraphrase:

- 37 No man can teach <u>true doctrine</u> (new wine) to an <u>unconverted person</u> (old bottle): because the <u>true doctrine</u> (new wine) will be rejected (burst) by the <u>person</u> (bottle) and the <u>person</u> (bottle) will be lost (perish).
- 38 But <u>true doctrine</u> (new wine) must be taught to <u>converted people</u> (new bottles); and both the doctrine and the person will be saved.
- 39 No man having <u>been taught</u> (drunk)

 <u>false doctrine</u> (old wine)

 immediately desires <u>true doctrine</u> (new wine):

 for he thinks the <u>false doctrine</u> (old wine) is better.

Conclusions:

When we first looked at the parable we concluded that the "type of container" that the "wine" was put in was very important. The container ("bottle") had to be new in order to preserve or retain "new wine".

Now we know that the parable is telling us that a **person** (bottle) has to be **converted** (new bottle) in order to accept **True Doctrine** (new wine).

An <u>unconverted</u> person (old bottle) will be satisfied with false doctrine (old wine) because he thinks that is <u>better</u> for **him**.

An <u>unconverted</u> person's life is focused on <u>pleasing</u> himself.

A converted person's life is focused on pleasing Jesus.

Conversion changes the focus of the life!

A <u>converted</u> person is willing to *follow Jesus* no matter what the <u>consequences to himself!</u>

Following True Doctrine will put a person out of step with the world and an unconverted person will not be willing to do that! The "testing Truths" or True Doctrines are designed by God to determine who really loves Him and to "weed out" the unconverted who love themselves more than God.

Jesus made it <u>very clear</u> that unless a person was **converted** (born again), they could <u>not</u> be part of His kingdom.

John 3:3 "Jesus answered and said unto him, verily, verily, I say unto thee, <u>Except</u> a man be <u>born again</u> he cannot see the kingdom of heaven.

This parable brings out how important conversion is! It is easy to determine if you are converted! Are you willing to do anything for Jesus? Are you willing to give up anything He asks you to? Would your job come before Jesus? Is your family more important to you than following Jesus? Is money more important to you than Jesus? Would you be willing to follow Jesus even if it cost you your friends? Remember, a converted person is willing to follow Jesus no matter what the consequences to himself! Jesus gave up everything for you!

John 15:13 "Greater love hath no man than this, that a man <u>lay</u> down <u>his</u> life for his friends." Are you willing to give up everything for Him?

Luke 14:33 "So likewise, whoever he be of you that forsaketh not all that he hath he cannot be my disciple."

Remember, that God LOVES YOU and NEVER asks you to "give up" anything that is not in your best interest! The "trinkets" and "tinsel" that this world has to offer cannot compare to what Heaven and Eternal Life can offer!

If you know in your heart that you are not converted, but you want to be converted, you can be "born again"!

All that God asks is that you be willing to put Him first in your life. Do you Love Him enough to be willing to do that? If you do, then bow your head and pray this simple prayer and God will give you conversion of heart and you will be born again!

Prayer:

Dear Lord, I can't understand how you could <u>ever love</u> <u>me</u>, but I believe that <u>you died</u> for **me** so that I could be <u>forgiven</u> for <u>all my sins</u>. Please <u>forgive me</u> and <u>come into</u> **my heart** and **change me completely!** Help me to be **willing** to *follow you* <u>completely</u>. Thank you for hearing my prayer.

In Jesus' precious name, Amen

Doctrinal Truth (Taught by **Jesus** in the Parable of "The Old and New Wine Bottles")

- Spiritual "Wine" represents Doctrine.
 Old wine represents False Doctrine.
 New wine represents True Doctrine.
- A Spiritual "Bottle" represents a Person.
 Old bottle represents an unconverted person.
 New bottle represents a converted person.
- 3. The main teaching of the parable is:
 A person (bottle) must be converted (new bottle)
 before they will accept True Doctrine (new wine).
- 4. An unconverted person will reject the "Truth" (True Doctrine) and the person will be lost.
- 5. An unconverted person's life is focused on pleasing himself.
- A converted person's life is focused on <u>pleasing</u>
 Jesus.
- 7. Conversion changes the focus of the life!
- 8. A converted person is willing to *follow Jesus* no matter what the <u>consequences to himself</u>!
- 9. True <u>Doctrine</u> is designed by God to determine who really loves Him and to "weed out" the unconverted who love themselves more than God.
- 10. **Jesus** gave up <u>everything</u> for **us** and He expects us to be willing to give up <u>everything</u> for **Him**.
- 11. **Jesus** will <u>never</u> ask us to "give up" anything that is not in <u>our best interest!</u>

- 12. We must put **Jesus** *before* family, friends, our job, money or <u>anything else!</u>
- 13. The "tinsel" and "trinkets" of this world and the love of friends or family cannot be compared to the love of God and the joys of Heaven and Eternal Life.
- 14. We **must** be **converted** or "born again" in order to be part of the kingdom of heaven.

The Parable Of:

"The Grain of Mustard Seed"

(The Importance of Faith and How to Obtain it)

The Parable of:

"The Grain of Mustard Seed" (Matthew 13:31, 32)

Matthew 13:31, 32

- 31 Another parable put he forth unto them, saying, The kingdom of heaven is like to a grain of <u>mustard seed</u>, which a man took, and sowed in his field:
- 32 Which indeed is the least of all seeds: but when it is grown, it is the greatest among herbs, and becometh a tree, so that the birds of the air come and lodge in the branches thereof.

Comments:

Jesus begins this parable by comparing the "kingdom of heaven" to being like a mustard seed. A comparison of Bible texts using the words "kingdom of heaven" shows that this phrase represents the "Church". In this instance then, Jesus is comparing the "Church" (kingdom of heaven) to being like a grain of mustard seed.

In the parable the <u>mustard seed</u> is described as being the "least" of all seeds. In other words the <u>mustard seed</u> is <u>very small</u>. The parable then describes how when the <u>mustard seed</u> is grown it becomes the "greatest" of all herbs and becomes a tree.

When we put what we have learned <u>together</u> we see that Jesus is saying:

The **Church** (kingdom of heaven) is like a <u>mustard seed</u>. In the beginning it will be <u>very</u> **small** (least), but it will grow and become the **greatest** of all at the last.

In this parable a *man* sowed the <u>mustard seed</u> in his field. In the parable of the "tares among the wheat" (Matthew 13:24-30; 30-43) **Jesus** or the "son of man" is the one who sowed the seed (verse 37). The field represents the world (verse 38). When we put what we have learned from the Bible together, we see that the parable tells us that it was Jesus (man) who "planted" or established (sowed) the Church (mustard seed) in the world (field). **Comparison of Scripture:** When we use the Concordance to look up the word "mustard", we discover that there are five texts in the Bible where this word is found. Three texts (Matt.13:31; Mark 4:31; Luke 13:19) describe the mustard seed as representing the "kingdom of heaven" or the Church. Two texts (Matt. 17:20, Luke 17:6) describe the mustard seed as representing Faith. We will now look at this second meaning as used in the parable. Matthew 17:20 And Jesus said unto them, because of your faith as a grain of mustard seed, ye shall say unto this mountain, remove hence to yonder place; and it shall remove; and nothing shall be impossible unto you. Luke 17:6 And the Lord said, If ye had faith as a grain of mustard seed, ye might say unto this sycamore tree, be thou plucked up by the root, and be thou planted in the sea; and it should obey you. These two texts make it plain that Jesus wanted us to also associate the "mustard seed" with Faith. It appears then,

mustard seed representing both the Church (kingdom of

that Jesus wanted us to see the connection between the

heaven) and our Faith.

We will look at the parable again and this time we will use the second meaning of "mustard seed" as Faith.

Matthew 13:31 "Another parable put he forth unto them, saying, The kingdom of heaven is like to a grain of mustard seed, which a man took, and sowed in his field: 32 Which indeed is the *least* of all seeds: but when it is grown, it is the *greatest* among herbs, and becometh a tree, so that the birds of the air come and lodge in the branches thereof."

We will <u>paraphrase</u> the text by <u>substituting</u> the meaning of *mustard seed* as "**Faith**".

Paraphrase:

The kingdom of heaven is like a tiny speck of **Faith** (mustard seed), which **Jesus** (man) took and <u>placed</u> (sowed) in the <u>world</u> (field). Although it is <u>very</u> **small** (least) at first, later when it has **grown**, it will be the <u>greatest</u> of all.

When we examine what we have learned we see several things:

- 1. At the start our <u>Faith</u> will be <u>very</u> **small**.
- 2. Our Faith can increase or grow.
- 3. <u>Jesus</u> is the one who gives us **Faith**.
- 4. The Church needs more Faith (Matt. 17:20)
- 5. As our Faith grows, the Church will grow.
- 6. Nothing will be impossible for us if we have Faith!

Now, we need to <u>learn more</u> about the word "<u>Faith</u>". We will begin by discovering the *definition* of "**Faith**" by using <u>Strong's Concordance</u>:

(Greek)

If ye have faith as a ... Matt. 17:20 ... #4102 ... Pistis

Conviction of religious truth, reliance upon Christ for Salvation, Constancy in profession, assurance, belief, believe, faith, fidelity.

Thus, "Faith" is belief in Christ and reliance upon Him for Salvation!

Now, let us learn <u>more</u> about "Faith" by <u>Comparing Scripture</u>.

Romans 12:3, 6

- 6...according to the proportion of <u>faith</u>;

Everyone has been given some amount of faith. Some have been given more than others. Each one is responsible for the amount given him.

Hebrews 12:2

2 Looking unto Jesus the author and finisher of our faith;....

Jesus gave us our faith to begin with and He will help us to increase our faith.

Hebrews 11:6

6 But without faith it is impossible to please him; for he that cometh to God must believe that he is, and that he is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him.

Sometimes the things we ask for are not \leftrightarrow received right away. This helps us to develop patience.

Sometimes we have \leftrightarrow hard trials and our faith is tested by God.

Remember that the end result of having faith is that God will \leftrightarrow save you!

Ephesians 2:8

8 For by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: it is the **gift** of God:

<u>Faith</u> is a **gift** from \leftrightarrow God.

Romans 4:29, 30

29 Is he the God of the **Jews only?** is he not also of the Gentiles also: 30 Seeing it is one God, which shall justify the circumcision by faith, and uncircumcision through faith.

Everyone whether they are Jews or Gentiles are saved one way; by faith. Jude 3
3 Beloved, when I gave all diligence to write unto you of the common salvation, it was needful for me to write unto you, and exhort you that ye should earnestly contend for the faith which was once delivered unto the saints.

→ There is a common Salvation for everyone but some have perverted the faith. We are to earnestly "contend" or "struggle" until we discover the truth or faith that was once given to God's people.

I Timothy 6:12 12 Fight the good fight of faith, lay hold on eternal life, whereunto thou art also called, and hast professed a good profession before many witnesses. II Timothy 4:7, 8 \leftrightarrow 7 I have fought a good fight, I have finished my course, I have kept the faith: 8 Henceforth there is laid up for me a crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous judge, shall give me at that day: and not to me only, but unto all them also that love his appearing.

We have to struggle or **fight** against the devil who wants to prevent us from having **faith**.

I John 5:4

4 For whatsoever is born
of God overcometh the
world: and this is the
victory that overcometh
the world, even our faith.

→

Our **faith** will give us the **victory** over the <u>devil</u> and the <u>world</u>.

Romans 4:22, 25

22 Even the righteousness of God which is by **faith** of <u>Jesus Christ</u> unto all and upon **all them** that **believe**: for there is no difference: 25 Whom God hath set forth to be a propitiation through **faith** \leftrightarrow **in his blood**, to declare his righteousness for the remission of sins that are past, through the forbearance of God;

When we believe and have faith in Jesus and His blood, His righteousness will be given to us and our sins will be forgiven!

Revelation 14:12
12 Here is the patience of the saints: here are they that keep the commandments of God, and the faith of Jesus.

God's people will overcome as they patiently keep the commandments of God and have faith in Jesus.

Summary:

In the parable Jesus predicts that the **Church** will begin as the *smallest* of "all kingdoms" but will continue to grow until it becomes *greater* than any earthly kingdom. The second meaning of the parable applies to our **Faith**.

Jesus describes how our **Faith** starts out very **small**, yet it

has the possibility of becoming great!

Jesus often chided people for their lack of faith: "O ye of little faith". As we compared the Scriptures to discover more about "faith", we learned why Jesus took the time to teach a parable about faith. We discovered that "without faith" it is impossible to please God", and that it is "our faith" that will give us the victory to overcome the Devil and the world. Finally, we learned that our faith grows or increases as we study the Bible.

Doctrinal Truth (Taught by **Jesus** in the Parable of "The Grain of Mustard Seed")

- 1. **Jesus** is the one who "planted" or established the **Church**.
- 2. <u>Jesus</u> said that in the beginning the **Church** would be very **small**, but it would *grow* until it became <u>great</u>.
- 3. <u>Jesus</u> also said that our "**faith**" would be very **small** in the beginning, but our <u>faith</u> would *grow* until it too became <u>great</u>.
- 4. It is plain that <u>Jesus</u> has <u>connected</u> the *growth* of our "faith" with the *growth* of the "Church". As our faith grows so will the Church grow.
- 5. One definition of "faith" is belief in Christ and reliance upon Him for Salvation.
- 6. Jesus has given everyone the gift of some faith.
- 7. It is up to us to see that our <u>faith</u> increases.

- 8. Our **faith increases** as we *study the Bible* or "Word of God".
- 9. It will be impossible to please God without faith.
- 10. Faith helps us to "see" in our mind things that are not visible to the eye.
- 11. Faith is the opposite of doubt or unbelief.
- 12. When we <u>ask</u> God for something we are to have **faith** to <u>believe</u> that He **will** give it to us. If we <u>doubt</u> we will **not** receive anything.
- 13. If we do **not** receive the things we ask for <u>right away</u>, we are to have <u>patience</u>. This "testing" of our **faith** develops <u>patience</u>.
- 14. Everyone will be saved the same way by faith.
- 15. Our **faith** will give us the <u>victory</u> over the Devil and the world.
- 16. When we <u>believe</u> and have **faith** in <u>Jesus</u> and <u>His</u> **blood** shed for us, *His Righteousness* will be <u>given</u> to **us** and our <u>sins</u> will be <u>forgiven</u>.
- 17. God's people will *overcome* as they <u>patiently</u> keep the commandments of God and have **faith** in **Jesus**.

(Many People are in the Wrong Church)

The Parable of:

"Choosing The Broad Or Narrow Way"

Matthew 7: 13,14

13 "Enter ye in at the **strait** gate: for wide is the gate, and **broad** is the way, that leadeth to destruction, and many there be which go in thereat:

14 Because strait is the gate, and **narrow** is the way, which leadeth unto life, and few there be that find it".


We will use the Concordance to determine the meaning of the word "strait".

Enter ye in at the **strait** gate...Matthew 7:13.... #4728 #4728 στενός stěnŏs strait

...narrow (because of obstacles standing close by)
Thus, the word "strait" means narrow

Paraphrase: (1) Enter in at the narrow gate: because the wide gate and the broad way leads to destruction and there will be many that will go through the wide gate. The narrow gate leads to life and only a few will find it.

Paraphrase (2) Most people will be lost! Only a few people will be saved!! There is a way that leads to life and there is another way that leads to destruction! The way that leads to life is not easy to find and only a few find it. The way that leads to destruction is easy to find, and almost everyone is traveling on it.

Thus, the word "destruction" used in the text means to literally "die", and be "fully destroyed".

Comparing "Scripture With Scripture"

Luke 13:23-24

23 Then said one unto him, Lord are there few that be saved?
24 Strive to enter in at the strait gate: for many, I say unto you, will seek to enter in, and shall not be able.

Matthew 7:21-23

21 Not everyone that saith unto me, Lord, Lord, shall enter into the kingdom of heaven: but he that doeth the will of my father which is in heaven.

22 Many will say to me in that day, Lord, Lord, have we not prophesied in thy name? and in thy name cast out devils? and in thy name done many wonderful works?

23 And then will I profess unto them, I never knew you, depart from me, ye that work iniquity.

Since the "many" appear to be "Christians" and yet they will be lost, then the "broad way" and the "wide gate" that the "many" go through must represent the doors of False Churches that people enter and are deceived by (false prophets or false teachers).

The entire parable seems to be addressing **only** those who "**claim** to be **Christians**"!(prophesying in the name of Jesus and casting out devils) Matthew 7:22

If the "**many**" spoken of were those who did not claim to be Christians or heathen etc., then there should have been some plain description of them and there is **none**!

Therefore the "**many**" represent a **lot** of "**Christians**" who will be **lost**!!

Since the "many" who will be lost appear to be surprised when the Lord does not "know them", they must have been "Christians" who were deceived by their Religious teachers. They "thought" that they were "Christians", (prophesied, cast out devils, wonderful works) and yet were not, according to the Words of Jesus. They were "workers of iniquity" or sinners.

The **warning** that Jesus gives in the parable about "false prophets" in sheeps clothing who are inwardly like "ravening wolves" seems to have been **missed** by them. (see next page)

They accepted the **teachings** of their Religious Leaders as **truth** when it was **error**. Too late they discover that "all Churches" do **not** lead to heaven but rather the "way" is **narrow** and the true Church or Church that teaches **truth** must be **sought for**.

Matthew 7:15-17
15 Beware of false prophets, which come to you in sheeps clothing, but inwardly they are ravening wolves.
16 Ye shall know them by their fruits...

17 ...every **good tree** bringeth forth **good fruit**; but a *corrupt tree* bringeth forth *evil fruit*.

Watch out for teachers who will try to deceive you!

Inspect their fruit!

Outwardly, the Religious teachers or "prophets" appeared to be "Genuine Christians" (sheeps clothing), but in reality they were impostors and were instead being used by Satan (ravening wolves) to destroy God's people (sheep) and prevent them from learning truth. (false prophets teach false things).

These "deceived Christians" that will be lost will not have an excuse, because Jesus has clearly told them how to tell the difference between a teacher of truth and a false teacher!

The "test" of the teacher is to examine their "fruit". ("Ye shall know them by their fruits") Matthew 7:16-20

It is **not enough** evidently to look on the "outward appearance" and see a "distinguished" looking man or a "kind person" or even a "good speaker". Even having a "**Phd.** in Religion" is **not enough**, as the "**Pharisees**" (Drs. of the law) in Jesus' day have already shown us by their treatment of Jesus!

Let's "Compare Scripture with Scripture" and see what the Bible says about this "Fruit" we are to look for.

Luke 6:43,45,46

43 For a good tree bringeth not forth corrupt fruit; neither doth a corrupt tree bring forth good fruit.
45 A good man out of the good treasure of his heart bringeth forth

treasure of his heart bringeth forth that which is **good**; and an evil man out of the evil treasure of his heart bringeth forth that which is evil: for of the abundance of the heart the mouth speaketh.

46 And why call ye me, Lord, Lord, and do not the things which I say?

Matthew 7:19-21

19 Every tree that bringeth not forth **good fruit** is hewn down and cast into the fire.

20 Wherefore by their fruits ye shall know them.

21 Not every one that saith unto me, Lord, Lord, shall enter into the Kingdom of heaven; but he that doeth the will of my Father which is in heaven.

Fruit

A "good" man will produce "good" fruit

An "evil" man with "corrupt" fruit will not do the things the Lord says to do.

If a man's "fruit" is "good" he will do the will of God

Thus, the Bible tells us to "watchout" for religious teachers who will try to deceive us. In order to tell a "good teacher" from a "false teacher", the Bible tells us that a "good teacher" will DO the things that the Lord says to do, while a "false teacher" will not do the things the Lord says to do.

Thus, the "fruit" of the "teacher" is related to their obedience or disobedience to God!

John 15:4,5,10

4 Abide in me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit of itself, except it abide in the vine; no more can ye, except ye abide in me.

5 ...He that abideth in me, and I in him, the same bringeth forth much fruit: for without me ye can do nothing.

10 If ye keep my commandments, ye shall abide in my love; even as I have kept my Father's commandments, and abide in his love.

I John 3:6,7,10

6 Whosoever abideth in him sinneth not: whoso sinneth hath not seen him, neither known him. 7 Little children,

let no man deceive you: ...

10 In this the children of God are manifest, and the children of the devil: whosoever doeth not righteousness is not of God...

Fruit (cont.)

We must "abide" in Christ in order to bear "fruit".

Those "abiding" in Christ will keep His Commandments and will "abide" in His love.

Those "abiding" in Christ will not be willfully sinning.

Don't let any man deceive you on this.

God's children will be doing righteousness.

Those who sin willfully will not be in heaven!
Don't let any man deceive you on this.

The "Fruit" of the Holy Spirit is righteousness, not sinfulness!

I John 2:4,6

4 He that saith, I know him, and keepeth not his commandments, is a liar, and the truth is not in him. 6 He that saith he abideth in him ought himself also to walk, even as he walked.

Conclusions: (from comparison of Scripture)

- 1. A person cannot bear good "fruit" unless they "abide" in Jesus Christ. (John 15:4,5)
- 2. In order to "abide" in Christ and His love the person must be a "commandment keeper". (John 15:10; I John 3:6,4,24)
- 3. The distinction between those who are the "children of God" and the "children of the devil" is "made manifest" or made plain by whether they "do righteousness" or not. (I John 3:10)
- 4. Those entering into the kingdom of heaven will be those who "**do** the will of God". (Matt. 7:21; Luke 6:46-49; II Peter 1:4-11)
- 5. Those "abiding" in Christ and "keeping His Commandments will be given the Holy Spirit. (I John 3:22-24)
- 6. Those having the **Holy Spirit** will be "bringing forth" the "**fruit**" of the **Spirit** which is: love, joy, peace, longsuffering, gentleness, faith, meekness, temperance, goodness, righteousness, and truth, proving what is acceptable to the Lord. (Gal. 5:22,23; Eph. 5:9,10)

7. Those who do not "abide" in Christ will be "commandment breakers" (I John 2:4,6) and they will **not** be **doing** the things the Lord said to do. (Luke 6:46) Their "fruit" or "works of the flesh" will be these: adultery, fornication, uncleaness, lasciviousness, idolatry, witchcraft,... wrath, strife, seditions, heresies, envyings, murders, drunkenness, revellings, whoremonger, covetousness. (Gal. 5:19-21; Eph. 5:5-7) They are called the "children of disobedience" (Eph.5:6) or "workers of iniquity" (Matt. 7:21-23) Now let's compare Scripture to discover the meaning of the "gates" in the Parable. GATE (Physical) The parable mentions two "gates"; a "narrow" gate" and a "broad gate". When we think of a "gate" we normally think of the entrance into a city. 1. The first text in the Bible that mentions a gate is Gen. 19:1. The gate of the wicked city Sodom. 2. The last text in the Bible that mentions a gate is


- Rev.21:21. The gate of the Holy City, New Jerusalem.
- 3. Those that entered the gate of Sodom and stayed there, received the reward of destruction. (Luke 17:29)
- 4. Those that enter the gate of the New Jerusalem will stay there, and receive the reward of eternal life. (Rev. 21:1,2; Rev. 22:14,15)

GATE (Spiritual)

A "city" represents a group of people. The kind of city, represents the kind of people

Holy City ← God's people or God's Church

Wicked City ↔ Deceived people or False Church



CITY = God's people (Holy)

Isa.52:1 "...Jerusalem the Holy City".

CITY = Wicked people (wicked)

Hosea 6:8"... Gilead is a city of them that work iniquity ".

Thus, the "gate" of the city would represent entrance into either: God's Church or a False Church.

"narrow" gate ↔ entering God's Church
"broad" gate ↔ entering a False Church

Genesis 28:17,19 17 And he was afraid, and said, How dreadful is this place! This is none other but the

house of God, and this is the gate of heaven.

19 And he called the name of that place

gate = house of God (of heaven) (Church)

Jeremiah 7:2 2 Stand in the gate of the Lord's house, and proclaim there place to this word, and say, worship Hear the word of gate of the the Lord the Lord, all ye of (Lord's house) (Church) Judah, that enter in at these gates to worship the Lord.

Thus, the "gate" of heaven" represents the "narrow gate" or true Church of God.

Now let's look at the; "Broad gate" or "False Church"

→ False teachers lie

The false teachers tell the people that once they join the Church then they are *saved and not "under the 10 commandment law", and are at liberty to do whatever they want. This is the "house" or Church called by the name of Christ. (Christian Church)

The Lord will reject the "Christian Church" and those calling themselves "Christians" who break His 10 commandments.

This is the "broad" gate or False Church that leads to destruction.

From: "The Living Bible"
II Peter 2:12,19-22

"But false teachers are fools --- no better than animals. They do whatever they feel like;... "You aren't saved by being good," they say, "so you might as well be bad. Do what you like, be free."

But these very teachers who offer this "freedom" from law are themselves slaves to sin and destruction. For a man is a slave to whatever controls him. And when a person has escaped from the wicked way of the world by learning about our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, and then gets tangled up with sin and becomes its slave again, he is worse off than he was before. It would be better if he had never known about Christ at all than to learn of him and then afterwards turn his back on the holy commandments that were given to him. There is an old saying that "A dog comes back to what he has vomited and a pig is washed only to come back and wallow in the mud again." That is the way it is with those who turn again to their sin.

Dearly loved friends, I have been planning to write you some thoughts about the salvation God has given us, but now I find I must write of something else instead, urging you to stoutly defend the truth which God gave, once for all, to his people to keep without change through the years. I say this because some godless teachers have wormed their way in among you, saying that after we become Christians we can do just as we like without fear of God's punishment. The fate of such people was written long ago, for they have turned against our only Master and Lord, Jesus Christ.

The New Covenant

16 This is the covenant that
I will make with them after
those days, saith the Lord,
I will put my laws into
their hearts, and in their
minds will I write them.

It would not make sense for God to "write His Law" in our hearts and minds and then tell us to "do away" with His Law!!

26 For if we sin wilfully after that we have received the knowledge of the truth, there remaineth no more sacrifice for sins,

27 But a certain fearful looking for of judgment and firey indignation, which shall devour the adversaries. 28 He that despised Moses law died without mercy under two or three witnesses: 29 Of how much sorer punishment, suppose ye, shall he be thought worthy, who hath trodden under foot the Son of God, and hath counted the blood of the covenant, wherewith he was sanctified, an unholy thing, and hath done *despite unto

the Spirit of grace?

If we sin wilfully after we have learned the truth, the sacrifice of Jesus's blood will no longer cover our sins.

We can expect the **Judgment** and **firey indignation** of God without mercy.

By wilfully sinning after knowing the truth, we are insulting God and Jesus and the Holy Spirit by "treading under our feet" the Blood of Jesus that was shed for our sins that broke God's covenant or Law of 10 commandments.

*The word "despite" #1796 means "to insult".

The Parable said that "few" find the narrow "way". The Bible gives us reasons why "few" find it!

II Peter 2:1-2

1 But there were
false prophets also among
the people, even as there
shall be false teachers among
you, who privily shall bring
in damnable heresies, even
denying the Lord that
bought them, and bring upon
themselves swift destruction.
2 And many shall follow their
*pernicious ways; by reason
of whom the way of truth
shall be evil spoken of.

False teachers deceive the "many"

* #684 destructive

Comment:

When people discover the "way" of truth, (narrow way), their false teachers "speak evil" or say bad things about those teaching the truth and turn them away from finding and following the truth or "narrow" way!

They are led to believe that such a small group ("few") could not have the truth ("narrow" way), but God says "Thou shalt not follow a multitude to do evil." Ex. 23:2 or to paraphrase the text:

You shall not follow the "many" to break God's Law.

WAY (cont.)

John 14: 5,6

5 Thomas saith unto him, Lord, we know not whither thou goest; and how can we know the way? 6 Jesus saith unto him, I am the way, the truth and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me.

Anyone can know the "way" by following Jesus.

Proverbs 12: 28

28 In the way of righteousness is **life**; and in the pathway thereof there is no death.

The "way" of righteousness leads to life.

Proverbs 10:17

17 He is in the **way** of **life** that keepeth instruction: but he that refuseth reproof erreth.

When we keep instruction and are willing to receive correction, we are in the "way" of life.

Acts 24:14

14 But this I confess unto thee, that after the way which they call heresy, so worship I the God of my fathers, believing all things which are written in the law and in the prophets. The "way" will be called heresy but it will be the truth and it consists of "believing all things that are written" in the law (10 Commandments) and in the prophets (the rest of the Bible).

WAY (cont.)

Proverbs 14:12 12 There is a way which seemeth right unto a man, but the end thereof are the

ways of death.

There is another "way" which "seems right" but it is the wrong way and leads to death(this is the broad "way" which leads to destruction). Notice that this "way" "seems right"!! Apparently most of the Christian world, the "many" will be fooled by Satan and his false teachers into taking this "way".

Isaiah 3:12

12 As for my people, children are their oppressors, and women rule over them. O my people they which lead thee cause thee to err, and destroy the way of thy paths.

It is their Religious Leaders that cause God's People to err and take the wrong "way". Their Pastors and Teachers "destroy" the right "way"!

Malachi 2:7-9

7 For the **priest's lips** should keep knowledge, and they should seek the law at his mouth: For he is the messenger of the Lord of hosts.

8 But ye are departed out of the way: ye have caused many to stumble at the law; ye have corrupted the covenant of Levi, saith the Lord of hosts. 9 Therefore have I also made you contemptible and base before all the people, according as ye have not kept my ways, but been partial in the law. The Priests and Pastors have "departed out of the "way" or left the truth of God.
They have caused "many" (broadway) to be "partial" in the Law or in other words, they have prevented them from "keeping all the law".
Evidently there is a part of the Ten Commandments that the Priests and Pastors do not want to keep and so tell the people that they don't have to keep that part of the Law either.

Doctrinal Truth (Taught by Jesus in the Parable of "Choosing the Broad or Narrow Way")

- 1. Only a "few" will receive eternal life.
- 2. "Many" people will think that they are going to receive eternal life, but they will be destroyed instead.
- 3. It is false teachers that cause the "many" to be destroyed.
- 4. The false teachers "appear" to be "Genuine Christians" (sheeps clothing) but they are not.
- 5. The Lord advises us to "test" our teachers by observing their "fruit", instead of looking at the "outward appearance" (sheeps clothing)
- 6. Jesus said that no one could produce "good fruit" unless they "abide in Him". He also said that if they would "keep His Commandments" they would "abide in His love".
- 7. When a person "abides in Jesus" and "keeps His Commandments", they will be given the Holy Spirit, which is the good "fruit" producer.

 (I John 3:24; Gal.5:22,23; Eph.5:5-7)
- 8. Since the "broad way" Christians "thought" that they were "abiding in Jesus" but were not because Jesus said He "never knew them", it is very important to be able to know with certainty that you are "abiding" in Jesus!

9. The "test" for knowing with certainty that you are "abiding" in Jesus is a very simple one. Do you keep the Commandments of God? If you do, then you may know with certainty that you are "abiding" in Jesus and He is abiding in you! If you don't, then you are not "abiding in Jesus" and He is not "abiding in you". John 15:10 10 If ye keep my commandments, ye shall abide in my love;... I John 3: 6,24 6 Whosoever abideth in him sinneth not: whosoever sinneth hath not seen him, neither known him. 24 And he that keepeth his commandments dwelleth in him, and he in him. And hereby we know that he abideth in us, by the Spirit which he hath given us. 10. The "fruit" of a "teacher" or anyone cannot be good fruit, unless they are "keeping the commandments of God," because unless they are, they cannot be "abiding

in Jesus" and so cannot produce "good fruit"!

11.The "test" of a false teacher will show that they do not "keep the commandments" of God. Remember it is

not necessary that they "break them all".

They can keep 9 of them and "look" like a "Genuine Christian" (sheeps clothing) but in God's sight they are "not" "abiding in Him" and He does not know them! They only have to break one of them "wilfully" and then they are being "partial in the law". (Malachi 2:7-9)

James 2:10-12

10 For whosoever shall keep the whole law, and yet offend in one point, he is guilty of all.

12. Since the "test" of "abiding in Jesus" and determining "false teachers" centers on "keeping the 10 Commandments", it would be wise to consider each of the Commandments individually and to determine if any of them are being broken wilfully by the "teacher" whose "fruit" you are inspecting. Remember, that the Lord is not asking you to "judge" the heart and secret sins, but only outward, wilful breaking of any of the 10 Commandments.

The Ten Commandments

Exodus 20:1-17

- 1 And God spake all these words, saying,
- 2 I am the Lord thy God, which have brought thee out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of bondage.
- [1] 3 Thou shalt have no other gods before me.
- [2] 4 Thou shalt not make unto thee any graven image, or any likeness of any thing that is in heaven above, or that is in the earth beneath, or that is in the water under the earth:
 - 5 Thou shalt not bow down thyself to them, nor serve them: for I the Lord thy God am a jealous God, visiting the iniquity of the fathers upon the children unto the third and forth generations of them that hate me;
 - 6 And shewing mercy unto thousands of them that love me, and keep my commandments.
- [3] 7 Thou shalt not take the name of the Lord thy God in vain.
- [4] 8 Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy.
 9 Six days shalt thou labour, and do all thy work:

10 But the seventh day is the Sabbath of the Lord thy God: in it thou shalt not do any work, thou, nor thy son, nor thy daughter, nor thy manservant, nor thy maidservant, nor thy cattle, nor thy stranger that is within thy gates: 11 For in six days the Lord made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that in them is, and rested the seventh day: wherefore the Lord blessed the Sabbath day and hallowed it. [5] 12 Honour thy father and thy mother that thy days may be long upon the land which the Lord thy God giveth thee. [6] 13 Thou shalt not kill. 14 Thou shalt not commit adultery. [7] [8] 15 Thou shalt not steal. [9] 16 Thou shalt not bear false witness against thy neighbor [10] 17 Thou shalt not covet thy neighbor's house. Thou shalt not covet thy neighbors wife nor his manservant, nor his maidservant, nor his ox, nor his ass, nor anything that is thy neighbor's. 13 False teachers will "speak evil" about those who are True Christians and who are "abiding in Jesus" and "keeping His Commandments". Because there will be "few" in number on the "narrow way", false teachers will claim they cannot have the "truth. 14 False teachers will turn the "grace" of God into "lasciviousness" by telling people that once they become Christians they <u>no longer have to keep the Law</u> of God. This is why there is so much sin in the Church and why the world cannot tell a "Christian" from a "non Christian"!

- 15. The right way or "narrow way" is found by "believing all things in the Law and in the prophets, or in other words keeping all the Commandments and believing all the Bible.
- 16. The "many" on the "broad way" (workers of iniquity), will receive "destruction" as their reward. They will be destroyed by fire and brimstone from heaven, which will "burn them up" and leave nothing but ashes.
- 17. The "few" on the "narrow way" (Commandment keepers), will receive eternal "life" as their reward.
- 18. The "many" on the "broad way" who will be destroyed and the "few" on the "narrow way" who will receive Eternal Life in this parable were both claiming to be Christians or were Church Members!!

Revelation 22:14-16

- 14 Blessed are they that **do his commandments**, that they may have right to the tree of **life**, and may **enter in** through the **gates** into the **city**.
- 15 For without are dogs, and sorcerers, and whoremongers, and **murderers**, and **idolaters**, and whosoever loveth and maketh a **lie**.
- 16 I, Jesus have sent mine angel to testify unto you these things in the Churches. I am the root and the offspring of David, and the bright and morning star.

The Parable of:

The

"Two Men That Built Houses"

(The Bible the Basis for All Beliefs)

The Parable of:

"The Two Men that built Houses" (Matthew 7:24-29)

In the previous several parables, Jesus has been <u>warning</u> his listeners of the **dangers** that **false teachers** put them in. Their **eternal life** depends upon their recognizing the **difference** between the **truth** and **false teachings!**

He has warned them that "many" Christians will be lost while thinking they are saved! He has told them to "test" the "fruit" of their teachers and warned them that they will "look good" on the outside (sheeps clothing) but inwardly they are like wolves who want to destroy them! Not only did Jesus constantly implore his listeners to "do right" with His words, but His life was a constant example of "doing right"!

In contrast to this He <u>warned</u> his listeners against teachers who had learned the truth to "do right", but then turned around and began "doing wrong" all over again! These "false teachers" would tell their listeners that they no longer had to obey the commandments but that they were "free" and could do whatever they liked. The Bible compares them to being like a "pig" that was "washed" who returned to wallowing in the mud. "Christians" that followed their teachings would be like "salt" that had lost its savour and was fit for nothing but to be cast out!

Now, Jesus gives the **Parable** of:

"The Two Men that built Houses"

Matthew 7:24-27 The Two Men that built Houses 24 "Therefore whosoever heareth these sayings of mine, and doeth them, I will liken him unto a wise man, which built his house upon a rock: 25 And the rain descended, and the floods came, and the winds blew, and beat upon that house; and it fell not: for it was founded upon a rock. 26 And everyone that heareth these sayings of mine and doeth them not, shall be likened unto a foolish man, which built his house upon the sand: 27 And the rain descended, and the floods came, and the winds blew, and beat upon that house; and it fell: and great was the fall of it." Paraphrase: The one who hears what Jesus says and does it, is a wise man! He is like a man that built his house upon a rock. The one who hears what Jesus says and does not do it, is a foolish man! He is like a man that built his house on sand. When the rain, wind, and floods beat upon the two houses, only the one built upon the rock remained. The house built upon sand was destroyed. **Comments:** Nothing is said in the parable about the **type** of house being built. One house could have been a mansion on the sand by the seashore and the other house a log cabin on a rock in the mountains. Nothing is said about the materials that the houses were built out of. One house may have been built with marble stones and gold and silver, while the other house may have been built from wood and iron. There are several things that the parable does tell us. It tells us what the men building the houses were like! 91

Comments: (cont.)

One man was a wise man. The other man was foolish. The parable also tells us that there was a difference between the foundations of the two houses. The wise man had chosen to build his house upon a rock for his foundation. The foolish man had chosen to build his house upon sand for his foundation. No one forced either man to build in a certain way. Each man chose the foundation for his house. The whole parable seems to center around the fact that choosing the right foundation is what made one man wise and one man foolish. Jesus compares this choice to being like two men who listened to what He said.

One man listened and did what Jesus said to do. The other man listened and did not do what Jesus said to do. Thus, the primary teaching of this parable is very clear. You will Do what Jesus says if you are wise!! The second teaching of this parable is also clear. You must choose the right foundation to build on or all the rest of your efforts will be in vain!!

Let's compare

our two choices for "foundations":

1. rock or 2. sand

Summarizing

The differences between these two foundation materials:

Physical rock

- 1. Immovable
- 2. Changeless with respect to time.
- Anything attached to it is secure and can't be moved.
- 4. It will support anything that stands upon it and will not let it sink.
- 5. The Physical elements of rain, wind, floods will not affect it.

Spiritual rock

- 1. Spiritually Immovable.
- 2. Spiritually Changeless.
- 3. Anything attached is Spiritually Secure.
- 4. Spiritual **Support** for anything that stands upon it.
- 5. Spiritual Elements will **not** affect it.


Physical sand

- 1. Easily moved
- 2. Changes constantly.
- Anything attached to it is unsecure and can be easily moved.
- 4. It will **not** support anything that stands upon it, but will allow it to sink.
- 5. The Physical elements of rain, wind, floods will affect it.

Spiritual sand

- 1. Spiritually moved easily.
- 2. Spiritually changes const.
- 3. Anything attached is Spiritually **unsecure**.
- No Spiritual support for anything that stands upon it.
- 5. Spiritual elements will affect it.


Now we need to discover what the Bible says that "rock" and "sand" represent Spiritually, so that we will understand why these two "foundation" materials are so important!



ROCK = CHRIST

1Cor.10:4

"... They drank of that Spiritual **Rock** that followed them: and that **Rock** was **Christ**"



SAND = People

Joshua 11:4

"And they went out, and all their hosts with them, much people, even as the sand upon the seashore...".

Rock = Christ (God)

Sand = people (man)

Thus, the two possible "foundations" upon which we can build are either:

1. Rock --- God's Words

or

2. sand --- man's words

Let's look again at the "differences" between "rock" and "sand"

Spiritual "Rock" (Christ)

- 1. God is Immovable.
- 2. God is Changeless.
- 3. Anyone "attached" to God is (Spr.) Secure.
- 4. God will "Support" anyone who "stands" or depends upon Him and He will not let them "sink" Spiritually.
- 5. God is **not affected** by the Spiritual "Elements" of Satan and is **never** deceived.

Spiritual "sand" (man)

- 1. man is easily moved.
- 2. man changes constantly.
- 3. Anyone "attached" to man is (Spr.) unsecure.
- 4. man cannot "support" anyone who "stands" or depends upon him and anyone who does depend upon man will "sink" (Spr.).
- 5. man is affected by the Spiritual "Elements" and is easily deceived.

These "differences" clearly show us the advantage of "building on Rock" (God) for a "foundation" instead of "building on sand" (man).

Now we know why Christ gave this parable right after the parable of the Two Ways (broad and narrow), and after telling us to beware of false teachers and to "test their fruits".

Now, He has once again warned us not to trust in the words of men, but rather to trust in the Words of God!

Jere. 17:5...Cursed be the man that trusteth in man... :7 Blessed is the man that trusteth in the Lord...

So, the "foundation" of our beliefs MUST be based on the "Words" of God instead of the "words" of men or we are "foolish" and "cursed"!!

Why would anyone want to have their beliefs or their "foundation" based on the "words of men"?

They wouldn't! They have been deceived into thinking that "mens words" are "God's Words"!

Many people do not read God's Word (Bible) themselves, but rather depend upon a "man" (their preacher) to tell them what "God's words" are!! Their "foundation" is whatever the "man" (preacher) says!!

The preacher "man" may have the best intentions but he may be wrong in what he says!!

Jesus warned the people that their leaders would "teach" the "commandments of men" for doctrines and that their worship would be in vain!

Matthew 15:9; 12-14

9 But in vain they do worship me, teaching for doctrines the commandments of men.

(Worship is "in vain" if the "doctrines" and

"commandments of men" are being followed.)

12 Then came his disciples, and said unto him, Knowest thou that the Pharisees were "offended", after they heard this saying?

(Religious teachers will be "offended" because "their teachings" are questioned.)

13 But he answered and said, Every plant, which my heavenly Father hath not planted, shall be rooted up. 14 Let them alone: they be blind leaders of the blind. And if the blind lead the blind, both shall fall into the ditch.

(The "religious teachers" were "blind" to the truth and caused the people to be "blind" also, the result being that both the teachers and the people will be lost!)

Conclusion:

Thus, the primary teaching of this parable is that Christ (God) and His Words (Bible) are to be the "foundation" (rock) for all our beliefs!

We are not to base our beliefs on the


We are **not** to base our beliefs on the "sandy foundation" of the "**words** of **men**" (preachers or teachers)!

The "Words" of God are contained in the Bible.

The "words of men are contained in other books as well as in "sermons"!

The House

Now that we know that the "foundation" that we are to "build on" represents God's Words (Bible), we need to discover what the "house" being built in the parable represents.



HOUSE = Church (God's people)

Hebrews 3:6
"But Christ a son over His own house; whose house are we ..."

Thus, the Bible tells us that the "house" being built represents the Church. So, this is a parable about "the church" and how the "foundation" of "the Church" is very important! The parable describes two different "houses" or two different "Churches". One "house" or "Church" built by a foolish man and another "house" or "Church" built by a wise man. One Church built upon the foundation of God's Words.

One Church built upon the foundation of God's Words. One Church built upon the foundation of man's words.

The parable also tells us the "result" of building a "house" or "Church" upon each of these "foundations". The "Church" built upon the "foundation" of God's Word will stand firm against anything! The "Church" built upon the "foundation" of man's word will fall and be destroyed!

The Elements: (wind, rain, floods)

The parable tells us that after the "houses" were built they were "tested" by the elements of wind, rain, and floods.

Thus, the two types of Churches will be "tested" by the Spiritual "Elements" of (Spr) "rain", and (Spr) "wind" and (Spr) "floods" and only one of the Churches will remain after the test!


The Church that remains after the "test" is the Church that has for its "foundation" the Words of God.

The Church that falls during the "test" is the Church that has for its "foundation" the words of men.

Now we need to discover what the "test elements" of "wind", "rain", and "floods" represent Spiritually.

The "test" Elements:


(Rain, Floods, Wind)



RAIN = Doctrine (Teaching)

Deut.32:2


"My doctrine shall drop as the rain ...".



FLOODS = Ungodly men

Ps.18:4

"...The **floods** of **ungodly men** made me afraid".



WIND = Doctrine

Eph.4:14 "Be no more children, tossed to and fro and carried about with every wind of doctrine by the sleight of men, and cunning craftiness, whereby they lie in wait to deceive".

Rain = Doctrines of God Floods = ungodly men Wind = Doctrines of men

Thus, the "test" Elements will involve the Churches in a confrontation of choosing between:

the "Doctrines" of God or the "Doctrines" of men

Wind

Every "wind" of Doctrine that men can invent will be presented as "truth" to the Churches!

Just as when the Physical wind blows against a Physical rock there is no damage, so when the Spiritual "wind" of False Doctrine comes against a Church founded upon God's Words in the Bible, there is "no damage" and no one will be deceived because they know the truth!

In direct contrast, when Physical wind blows against Physical sand, there will be great damage because the "sand" will be Physically moved by the Physical wind and the result will be Physical collapse of the "House". Similarly, when the Spiritual "wind" of False Doctrine is presented to a Church founded upon the "words of men" (sand), the people of that Church will be "moved" by the False Doctrines (wind) and will be deceived and the Church will "fall" Spiritually.

Rain

its beliefs are the same.

When Physical rain falls on rock there is no change to the rock or the house built upon it.

Similarly, when the "Doctrines of the Lord" (rain) are presented to a Church founded upon Christ and His Word there is no change to that Church because

But, when Physical rain falls on sand there is a change, and some of the sand will move or "change its position". Similarly, when the "Doctrines of the Lord" are heard by some people who have been deceived, they will "change their position" Spiritually and leave that False Church and join the Church teaching the truth!!

Floods

As more and more Physical rain falls, at last the "floods" will come. When the "floods" beat against a "rock" or a "house" founded upon a "rock" there will be no change to the rock or the house on the rock.

Similarly, as the **Doctrines of the Lord** (rain) are presented to more and more people (sand), ungodly men (floods) will attempt to destroy the Church teaching truth (house on rock), to prevent the people (sand) from leaving the false Churches. Just as "sand" being removed from under a "house" would cause it to collapse, so the people (sand) leaving the False Churches will cause them to "fall".

Thus, the "test" to come to all the Churches and all the people is the "test" of who will you believe?

Will you believe the "words of men"?
or
Will you believe the "Words of God"?

Doctrinal Truth (Taught by Jesus in the Parable of "The Two Men that built Houses)

- 1 If you are **wise** you will **do** the things that Jesus has told you to do.
- 2 If you are **foolish** you will **not do** the things that Jesus has told you to do.
- 3 The wise person will have for his "foundation" (rock) Jesus Christ and His teachings in the Bible.
- 4 The foolish person will have for his "foundation" (sand) men and their teachings.
- 5 A Church(house) founded upon Christ(rock) and His teachings will stand against anything.
- 6 A Church(house) founded upon men(sand) and their teachings will fall and be destroyed.
- 7 Christ(God) is the "Rock" that is Immovable, Changeless, Our Security, Our Support, and Our Shelter in the time of Storm or "test".
- 8 Man is the "sand" that is easily moved, changes constantly, is unsecure, will not support anything, and cannot shelter anyone in the time of Storm or "test".
- 9 Each person and each Church will be "tested" and have to decide whether they will believe: the "words of men" or the "Words of God".

The Parable of:

"The Tares Among the Wheat"

(The Joining of the Churches)

The Parable of:

"The Tares Among the Wheat" (Matthew 13:24-30)

Matthew 13:24-30

- 24 Another parable put he forth unto them, saying, The kingdom of heaven is likened unto a <u>man</u> which sowed good seed in his <u>field</u>.
- 25 But while men slept, his <u>enemy</u> came and sowed <u>tares</u> among the <u>wheat</u>, and went his way.
- 26 But when the blade was sprung up, and brought forth fruit, then appeared the tares also.
- 27 So the <u>servants</u> of the <u>householder</u> came and said unto him, Sir, didst not thou sow good seed in thy field? From whence then hath it tares?
- 28 He said unto them, an enemy hath done this. The servants said unto him, wilt thou then that we go and gather them up?
- 29 But he said, Nay; lest while ye gather up the tares, ye root up also the wheat with them.
- 30 Let both grow together until the <u>harvest</u>: and in the time of harvest I will say to the <u>reapers</u>, <u>gather</u> ye together <u>first</u> the <u>tares</u>, and <u>bind them</u> in bundles to burn them: but gather the wheat into my barn.

Explanation of the Parable by Jesus (Matt. 13:36-43)

Matthew 13:36-43

- 36 Then Jesus sent the multitude away and went into the house: and his disciples came unto him, saying, Declare unto us the parable of the tares of the field.
- 37 He answered and said unto them, <u>he that soweth</u> the good seed is the <u>Son of Man</u>;
- 38 The <u>field</u> is the <u>world</u>; the <u>good seed</u> are the <u>children</u> of the <u>kingdom</u>; but the <u>tares</u> are the <u>children of the</u> wicked one.
- 39 The enemy that sowed them is the devil; the harvest is the end of the world; and the reapers are the angels.
- 40 As therefore the <u>tares are gathered</u> and burned in the fire; so shall it be in the end of the world.
- 41 The Son of Man shall send forth his angels, and they shall gather out of his kingdom all things that offend, and them which do iniquity;
- 42 And shall cast them into a furnace of fire; there shall be wailing and gnashing of teeth.
- 43 Then shall the <u>righteous</u> shine forth as the <u>sun</u> in the kingdom of their Father. Who hath ears to hear, let him hear.

Comments:

Since the meanings of the <u>real objects</u> used in the parable have been <u>explained</u> by Jesus, it makes paraphrasing the parable much easier. This parable, like the parable of the Pearl, has <u>two meanings</u>. The first meaning, using the "field" to represent the <u>entire world</u>, shows that at the end of time, the <u>entire world</u> will be divided into <u>two groups</u>. The second meaning, using the expression "His field" and "His kingdom" to represent the <u>Church</u>, shows that at the end of time the <u>Church</u> will be divided into <u>two groups</u>.

Parable (meaning 1)

Jesus (Son of Man) came into the world (field) and taught the truth to people (seed). Some people (good seed) listened and obeyed Him, and some people (tares) listened to the *Devil* (enemy) and obeyed him. At first the prophets and teachers (servants) of Jesus (householder) wanted to *separate* (gather out) those who were disobedient (do iniquity) from those who were obedient (righteous), but Jesus (householder) said no (nay) because they would remove some of the righteous (wheat) while they were removing those that did iniquity (tares). At the end of the world (harvest), the angels (reapers) will be sent by Jesus (Son of Man) and they will gather out of His kingdom all those that have disobeyed Him (do iniquity) and they will be burned with fire. Then, the angels will gather all those who have obeyed Him (righteous, wheat) together to enjoy the kingdom of their Father.

Doctrinal Truth (Taught by **Jesus** in the Parable of (meaning 1) "The Tares Among The Wheat")

- 1. Everyone will have an opportunity to hear the <u>truth</u> that Jesus taught.
- 2. Those that listen and obey Him are called the righteous.
- 3. Those that listen but refuse to obey Him are called doers of iniquity.
- 4. At the present time, both the <u>righteous</u> and the <u>doers of iniquity</u> are **together** as one.
- 5. At the end of the world a <u>separation</u> will be made by Jesus and His angels.
- 6. The doers of iniquity will be gathered together first.
- 7. Then, the righteous will be gathered together.
- 8. The doers of iniquity will be burned by fire.
- 9. The righteous will enjoy the kingdom of their Father.

Parable (meaning 2)

This parable makes it plain that at the <u>end of the world</u> there will be **two groups** of people (wheat **or** tares). At the <u>present time</u> there is only <u>one group</u> (wheat **and** tares). Jesus said that the "wheat" represents the <u>righteous</u> and that the "tares" represents those that <u>do iniquity</u> (verse 40-43)

Before the "gathering out" (verses 40, 41) of these two groups, the "tares" are mixed in with the "wheat" (verse 25). Thus, in the church (among the "wheat") are those that do iniquity ("tares"). This then, is a parable that tells us how the Lord is going to purify His Church by removing the "tares" from it!

Once the "gathering out" of the "tares" from the church has been done, then the "righteous shall shine forth as the sun" (verses 41-43). To "shine" means to "reflect light". Since the Bible calls Jesus Christ the "Sun of Righteousness" (Mal. 4:2), then the parable is saying that "the righteous will reflect the light (shine) of Christ's righteousness (sun)". In other words, the righteous will resemble Christ in character. They will have on the "robe of Christ's righteousness" and they will not be willfully sinning! Since to "shine" means to "reflect light" and "light" spiritually represents truth, the parable is also saying that the righteous will "teach the truth" (shine) about Christ's righteousness (as the sun).

Thus, once the <u>Church</u> has been <u>purified</u> by having those that <u>do iniquity</u> (tares) "gathered out", **then** the <u>Church</u> can do it's work of **teaching** all the **Truth** to those in the **world** who have **not heard** the **Truth!**

The "tares" (doers of iniquity) look like the "wheat" who represent the <u>righteous</u>. This means that the "tares" do not represent the "wicked" of the world, who do not "look like" the <u>righteous</u> but rather the "tares" represent the "wicked" (doers of iniquity) in the Church!

The "doers of iniquity" were described in the parable of the "Broad and Narrow Ways" as those "casting out devils", and doing many wonderful works in the Lord's name.

Thus, they are clearly professing "Christians". The parable says that the Lord will "gather out of His kingdom" the "tares" or those that offend. Here again it is plainly describing the Church as being purified.

No one will deny that there are more wicked people or "tares" in the world than there are "wheat" or righteous people. The text said that the "tares" were among the "wheat", which clearly means that the "wheat" were the majority and the "tares" were the minority. The only place in the world that the "wheat" or righteous are in the majority is in the Church. Therefore, to "gather out the tares from among the wheat" has to represent removing those who are "doers of iniquity" from the Church.

In the Parable the servants were instructed "not" to gather up the tares lest they root up also the wheat (verses 28, 29). This shows that the "wheat" and "tares" looked alike.

Thus, within the Church are those who on the outside appear to be "Christians" (look like wheat) but who are really "doers of iniquity" (tares). Men cannot tell the difference, but the Lord and the angels (reapers) can, and they will "gather" them out of the Church (verses 30, 40, 41). When this happens, there will be two groups of "Church members"—those left in a True Church group and those professing to be "Christians" in a False Church group.

During the "time of the harvest" or at the end of the world, the "tares" were to be "gathered out" first and bound together (verse 30). Then, the "wheat" was to be "gathered into the barn". This means that the first group of professing "Christians" to be united or "bound together" will represent the False Church group which will ultimately be "burned up" (verse 30). This group will be a very large group of professing "Christians". This parable calls them "doers of iniquity", and we know from our study of the parable of the "Broad and Narrow Ways" that the many were "workers of iniquity" and that they were professing "Christians" doing many things in the Lord's name (casting out devils, etc.).

Since the "Church" represents all Christian denominations, then we would expect there to be a "gathering out" and a "binding together" of all Christian denominations except for those who represent the True Church, who consist of those who are really Christians and who the Lord calls the "righteous".

After the "binding together" or uniting of the many False "Christians", then the "wheat" or True Christians who are in every denomination will be "gathered together" or united together into the Lord's "barn" or True Church (verse 30).

Those who have united together in the first False Church group will be burned up (verses 30, 40-42)! Those who have not united together with the first False Church group will be "gathered together" into God's True Church and will "enjoy the kingdom of their Father" (verses 30, 43)!

Doctrinal Truth (Taught by **Jesus** in the Parable of "The Tares Among The Wheat")

- 1. According to Jesus "wheat" represents the "children of the kingdom" or the **righteous**.
- 2. According to Jesus "tares" represent the "children of the wicked one" or doers of iniquity.
- 3. The "tares" represent the "doers of iniquity" within the Christian Church. They appear to be "Christians" but are really "doers of iniquity".
- 4. The "tares" or "doers of iniquity" will be gathered out of the Church by the Lord and the angels at the end of the world.
- 5. At the *present time* there is only **one** <u>group</u> of people that make up the **Church**; a **mixture** of "wheat" and "tares" or a mixture of <u>righteous</u> and <u>doers of iniquity</u>.
- 6. At the **end** of the <u>world</u> there will be **two** groups of people; either "wheat" or "tares" or a separation between the <u>righteous</u> and the <u>doers of iniquity</u>.
- 7. When the "doers of iniquity" (tares) have been separated from the "righteous" (wheat), the Church will have been purified.
- 8. When it has been **purified**, then the **Church** will "shine forth as the sun", which means that those left will "reflect the light (shine) of Christ's righteousness (of the sun)". They will resemble Christ in **character**. (They will not be willfully sinning.) They will teach the **truth** (shine) about **Christ's righteousness** (as the sun) to all the world.

- 9. At the "time of harvest" or at the **end** of the <u>world</u>, the "tares" or "doers of iniquity", will be gathered **out first** and be "**bound** together".
- 10. This First group of "doers of iniquity" will be a very large group of professing "Christians" who will Unite or be "bound together". They represent the False Church or the "many" on the "Broad Way" who "cast out devils", etc. in the Lord's name but who will receive the reward of destruction or being burned up.
- 11. After the Uniting of this First large group of professing "Christians" who comprise the False Church, there will be a Second group consisting of True Christians who will be "gathered together" by the Lord.
- 12. This **Second group** will be "**few**" in number compared to the "**many**" in the **First group**, but the "<u>few</u>" in the **Second** group represent the **True Church** and the Lord calls them the "<u>righteous</u>". They will receive the reward of **Eternal Life** and enjoy the "kingdom of their Father".
- 13. The "rewards" given, are not given until the "end of the world". This means that no one is burning in hell now! The wicked will be burned up at the end of the world! The righteous receive Eternal Life at the end of the world.

The Parable of:

The

"Right Eye Plucked Out"

(What Hell is Like.)

The Parable of:

"The Right Eye Plucked Out" (Matthew 5:29)

Matt. 5: 29

29 "And if thy **right eye** "**offend**" thee, pluck it out, and cast it from thee: for it is profitable for thee that one of thy **members** should perish, and not that thy **whole body** should be <u>cast into hell</u>."

This parable <u>begins</u> the teachings of Jesus regarding **Hell.** It teaches us that people will be <u>cast into hell</u> "**bodily**" or to put it another way, they will be **burned up** as **real people** having arms and legs, etc. rather than as "spirits".

In the parable of the "wheat and the tares", Jesus teaches that the wicked(tares) will be "cast into hell" at the end of the world, thus teaching that all the wicked receive their punishment at the same time.

Matthew 13: 40-42

- 40 "As therefore the tares are gathered and burned in the fires; so shall it be in the end of this world.
- 41 The Son of man shall send forth his angels, and they shall gather out of his kingdom all things that **offend**, and them which do iniquity;
- 42 And shall **cast** them into a **furnace** of **fire**: there shall be wailing and gnashing of teeth."

We will use the Concordance to see what the <u>Bible says</u> about **Hell**, and then we will look at this Parable.

THE BIBLE CONCEPT OF HELL

THE BIBLE CONCEPT OF HELL

The **Hellfire** will <u>not continually burn</u> the wicked forever but will <u>burn them up</u> and then **go out**.

Nahum 1:9,10

"What do you <u>imagine against the LORD</u>? he will make an **utter end**:..they shall be <u>devoured as stubble</u> fully dry."

Malachi 4:1,3

"All that do wickedly, <u>shall be stubble</u>: and the day that cometh shall <u>burn them up</u>,..it shall leave them neither root nor branch...they shall be **ashes**.."

Isaiah 47:14

"Behold, they shall be <u>stubble</u>; the fire shall <u>burn</u> <u>them</u>;..there shall **not be a coal** to warm at, **nor fire** to sit before it."

Hellfire destroys both body and soul of the wicked. Matt.10:28

"And fear not them which kill the body, but are not able to kill the soul: but rather fear him which is able to destroy both soul and body in hell."

Ezekiel 18:4

"Behold, all souls are mine; as the soul of the father, so also the soul of the son is mine: the **soul** that sinneth, it shall **die**."

Psalms 22:29

"All they that go down to the dust...and <u>none</u> can <u>keep alive</u> his own **soul**."

Psalms 49:7,8

"None of them can by any means redeem his brother, nor give to God a ransom for him: For the <u>redemption</u> of their soul is precious, and it <u>ceaseth for ever</u>."

THE BIBLE CONCEPT OF HELL

No one has an "immortal soul" that lives on forever. Only God has Immortality. Immortality is given to the righteous as a gift from God when He comes in the clouds of heaven. The wicked never receive immortality but are destroyed, never to exist again.

1Timothy:15,16

.. "The King of kings, and <u>Lord</u> of lords; <u>Who only</u> hath **immortality**"

Romans 2:7

"To them who by patient continuance in well doing seek for glory and honor and **immortality**,.."

1Corinthians 15:53,54

"For ..this <u>mortal</u> must <u>put on **immortality**</u>. ...then shall be brought to pass the saying that is written, "<u>Death</u> is swallowed up in <u>victory</u>."

<u>Satan</u> himself is **not immortal** but will be **destroyed** along with all the wicked.

Ezekiel 28:12-14

"..Thou hast been in Eden the garden of God...

Thou art the anointed cherub that covereth.."

Ezekiel 28:16,18,19

"I will **destroy** thee, O <u>covering cherub</u>,.. a <u>fire</u>.. shall devour thee, and I will bring thee to **ashes** upon the earth..and <u>never shalt thou be any more</u>."

Rev.20:10

"And the <u>devil</u> that deceived them was cast into the lake of <u>fire</u> and brimstone..."

SUMMARY OF: THE BIBLE CONCEPT OF HELL

- 1. The Bible says that the <u>fire</u> of <u>Hell</u> is not **kindled**" or started until the <u>end of the world</u>.
- 2. The fire of HELL is <u>not in the earth</u> or any place else. **Hellfire** will **come down from God** out of heaven and <u>fall on the earth</u>.
- 3. The **Hellfire** will <u>not continually burn</u> the wicked forever but will <u>burn them up</u> and **go out**.
- 4. **Hellfire** destroys <u>both</u> **body** and **soul** of the wicked.
- 5. No one has an "immortal soul" that lives on forever. Only God has Immortality. Immortality is given to the righteous as a gift from God when He comes in the clouds of heaven. The wicked never receive immortality but are destroyed, never to exist again.
- 6. <u>Satan</u> himself is **not immortal** but will be **destroyed** along with all the wicked.

Now we will continue with the Parable of: "The Right Eye Plucked Out"

The **Parable** of: "The Right Eye Plucked Out" (Matthew 5:29)

Matt. 5: 29

29 "And if thy **right eye** "**offend**" thee, pluck it out, and cast it from thee: for it is profitable for thee that one of thy **members** should perish, and not that thy **whole body** should be cast into hell."

To "pluck out" an eye is a serious thing, whether the "eye" is literal or Spiritual! Therefore, we need to know clearly what it means to "offend" and what the

"right eye" means.

We will first look at the literal meaning of "offend":

Offend Mt.5:29 #4624 (scandalize) to entrap or entice to sin, make to offend, scandal, snare, cause of sin....

Thus, to "offend" literally means to sin and cause others to sin. Now, let's see what the Bible says about "offend".

Matt. 13: 41

41 The Son of man shall send forth his angels, and they shall gather out of His kingdom all things that **offend**, and them which **do iniquity**;

Romans 5: 18,19

18....by the offence of one, judgment came upon all

19 For as by one man's disobedience many were made sinners,

Thus, the Bible agrees that to "offend" means to sin and cause others to sin.

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Let's look at the text "Physically" first:

On the surface the text says <u>literally</u> or <u>physically</u>:

Paraphrase:

If our "eye" causes us to sin ("offend"), then it would be better for us to remove that "eye" (pluck out one of the members) and let the "eye" die (perish) than to have our "whole body" (arms, legs, feet, etc.) cast into hell.

<u>Physically</u>, this parable teaches us that what we **look at** physically will affect what we **do** physically and it will affect what **happens to us physically** (cast into hell or go to heaven).

Now, let's look at the text "Spiritually":

Paraphrase:


If our Spiritual "eye" causes us to sin ("offend"), then it would be better for us to remove that Spiritual "eye" (pluck out one of the members) and let the Spiritual "eye" die (perish) than to have our "whole Spiritual body" cast into hell.

A (Spiritual) "eye" is used by a (Spiritual) "body" to (Spiritually) guide each of its (Spiritual) "members"

Now we need to discover what the <u>Spiritual meaning</u> of this Parable is by discovering what the "**right eye**" and other <u>Real Objects</u> mean **Spiritually.**

(Spiritual)

Eye = Prophet or Leader




EYES = prophets of God

Isa.29:10"..The Lord... hath closed your eyes; the Prophets and your rulers, the seers hath he covered."

1Sam.9:9"... A prophet was beforetime called a seer."

Eye = Wisdom and Understanding



EYES = wisdom and understanding

Eph.1:18 "The eyes of your understanding being enlightened." Isa.29:14 "...for the wisdom of their wise men shall perish, and the understanding of their prudent men shall be hid."

Thus the (Spiritual) "eye" of the church is its Prophet or Minister or Pastor who is supposed to lead the people wisely. In the Parable the "eye" "offended" or was a snare and caused others to sin. The Parable stated that the "right eye" (that offended) was to be "plucked out".

Let's see what the Bible says about the "right eye".





Thus, the Bible has confirmed that the "right eye" to be plucked out, represents a Pastor or Minister who "lacks understanding" and who "leaves his flock" or fails to properly lead them and so causes them to "go astray" or be disobedient to God.

Now we will continue on and learn the Spiritual meaning of the other Real Objects in the Parable.

(Spiritual)

Body = The Church

I Cor.12:27,28

Now ye are the body of Christ, and members in particular.

(Spiritual)

Members = Individual Persons in the church

Conclusions:

- 1. To "offend" means to sin and cause others to sin.
- 2. A Spiritual "eye" is a Prophet or Pastor that is supposed to lead God's people wisely.
- 3. A Spiritual "eye" that "offends" represents a Pastor that causes his Church members to sin.
- 4. A Spiritual "right eye" that has been darkened represents a Pastor that <u>lacks understanding</u> and so causes his Church members to "go astray" or sin.
- 5. A Spiritual "body" represents all the people in a Church.
- 6. A Spiritual "member" represents an individual person in a Church.

When Jesus said; "And if thy **right eye** offend thee, pluck it out, and cast it from thee: for it is profitable for thee that one of thy **members** should perish, and not that thy whole **body** should be cast into hell", He was Spiritually saying;

Paraphrase:

If your **Pastor** (right eye) <u>lacks understanding</u> and because of this is **causing** the Church members **to sin** because **they don't know Gods will** (offend), the Church should **remove him** (pluck it out).

It is better for the Church that one of the members (Pastor/right eye) should be lost (perish), instead of the whole Church (whole body) being lost or cast into hell.

Doctrinal Truth (Taught by **Jesus** in the Parable of "The Right Eye Plucked Out")

- 1. What we **look at** (physically) will affect what we **do** (physically) and it will affect what **happens to us** (physically).
- 2. We will either be lost (cast into hell) or saved (receive eternal life), depending upon how we control what we look at. (pluck out the right eye if it offends).
- 3. If we are lost (cast into hell) we will be "cast into hell" as a whole person (bodily) with arms, legs etc. and burned, rather than as a "spirit".
- 4. The Pastor of a Church is to be the Spiritual "eye" or leader of the people.
- 5. The Pastor must have "correct understanding" of Spiritual Truth if he is to properly lead the people of the Church.
- 6. There are Pastors that <u>lack correct understanding</u> of Spiritual truth and **their** lack of understanding will **cause** the members of the Church to sin or disobey God's will.
- 7. If a Church discovers that their Pastor lacks understanding of Spiritual truth they are to **remove him**.
- 8. The "removal" of a Pastor lacking understanding of Spiritual Truth is very important, in order to prevent the **Whole Church** from being **deceived and lost** or "cast into hell".

and

The Desolate Land

(The 1000 Years)

The Parable of:

The **Feast** of the **Birds** and

The Desolate Land

Rev.19:11 "And <u>I saw heaven opened</u>, and behold a white horse; and he that sat upon him was called Faithful and True, and in righteousness he doth <u>judge</u> and <u>make war</u>.

:16 And he hath on his vesture and on his thigh a <u>name</u> written, **KING OF KINGS**, AND **LORD OF LORDS**.

:17 And I saw an angel standing in the sun; and he cried with a loud voice, saying to all the **fowls** that fly in the midst of heaven, come and gather yourselves together unto the **supper** of the great God: that ye may <u>eat</u> the flesh of kings, and the flesh of captains, and the flesh of mighty men."

Matthew 24:27,28

"For as the lightning cometh out of the east and shineth even unto the west so shall also the coming of the Son of Man be.

For wheresoever the carcass is, there will the eagles be gathered together."

The above Bible verses clearly tell us that when **Jesus comes** the Second time, the **wicked** will be **food** for the **birds** or **"fowls**".

Lets see what the Bible says about this "feast day for the birds".



	1. When Jesus comes the 2^{nd} Time He will be visible like the lightning which shines from east to west.
	2. When Jesus comes the 2^{nd} Time the wicked will all be slain and they will become food for the birds or fowls.
	3. The whole earth or land will be desolate with no human life on it and yet God will not yet make a full end.
	4. The wicked dead and Satan will remain on the desolate earth for 1000 years, the period of time often refered to as the Millenium.
	5. During this same 1000 year period, the righteous will all be in heaven with Jesus.
	6. At the end of the 1000 year period, <u>Jesus returns</u> to the earth for the 3 rd Time and resurrects the wicked dead.

"Let The Dead Bury The Dead"

(The Condition of the Dead)

The Parable of:

"Let The Dead Bury The Dead" (Matthew 8:19-22)

19 And a certain scribe came and said unto him, Master, I will follow thee whithersoever thou goest.

- 20 And Jesus saith unto him, The foxes have holes and the birds of the air have nests; but the Son of man hath not where to lay his head.
- 21 And another of his disciples said unto him, Lord suffer me first to go and bury my father.
- 22 But Jesus said unto him, Follow me; and let the dead bury their dead.

In this parable the "Main Theme" seems to be about "Following Jesus". In the first part of the parable, a "scribe" says that he will "follow Jesus", and in the second part "another disciple" says that he will "follow Jesus" after he buries his father.

The "answers" that Jesus gives in both parts of the parable don't seem to make sense, on the surface. In the first part of the parable Jesus says: "foxes have holes and the birds of the air have nests; but the Son of man hath not where to lay his head."

What do the "holes" of foxes and the "nests" of birds And Jesus himself "not having a <u>place to sleep</u>" have to do with "following Him"?

In the second part of the parable Jesus says: "Let the dead bury their dead". How can a dead person bury another dead person? The dead person would have to be alive in order to bury another dead person! Is Jesus trying to teach us that the dead are really alive or is he trying to teach us just the opposite, that the dead are really dead and can't do anything! Also, is there a connection or relationship between Having "no place to sleep" and whether the "dead are really dead or alive"? This parable implies that there is a connection and that it is important to know what that connection is so that we can "follow Jesus". Let's see if we can discover any "connection" between: 1. Having "no place to sleep" and 2. Whether the "dead are really dead or alive" We will start with the first part of the parable and think about the Physical: 1. Foxes have holes 2. Birds of the air have nests 3. Jesus has no place to sleep The fox "sleeps" below the surface of the ground, in a hole in the earth. The bird "sleeps" above the surface of the ground, in a nest in the air. Jesus has no place to "sleep". Thus, there are three possible places to "sleep": 1. **Below** the surface of the earth 2. Above the surface of the earth 3. No where or no place

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In the second part of the parable Jesus says: "Let the dead bury the dead".

When a person is "buried", they are usually placed below the surface of the ground, in a hole in the earth.

Sometimes, when a person is "buried" they are placed above the surface of the ground, in a vault in the air.

The third way that a person is "buried" is by cremation or being burned with fire until only ashes remain. These ashes are usually "scattered" in the air or over water and so do not end up in any place.

Thus, there are three possible places to be "buried" when you are "dead":

- 1. Below the surface of the earth
- 2. Above the surface of the earth
- 3. No where or no place

When we compare what we have learned about (places to "sleep") and (places to be "buried"), there seems to be a definite "connection" or relationship between: "sleep" and "death".

Thus, in this parable, Jesus has "connected" the subjects of: "sleep" and "death" and "following Him".

In order to "follow Jesus" we need to discover what the Bible says about the subjects of: "death" and "sleep". Since the parable used the word "dead", we will use the Concordance to look up Bible texts that talk about the "dead" in order to learn more about that subject.

THE BIBLE CONCEPT OF DEATH

We have just learned some amazing things from the Bible concerning "death" or the "dead"! The Bible compares death to sleep. When someone is "asleep" they have no knowledge of anything that is going on around them. That is what the Bible says "death" is like, no knowledge of anything. The Bibles concept of "death" is completely different from the popular concept about "death", which teaches that we have knowledge of things going on around us after we die. The "main theme" of this parable is "following Jesus" and the subject is "death". Let's see what Jesus believed about "death", so that we can "follow Him". John 11:11-14 11 These things said he: and after that he saith unto them, Our friend Lazarus sleepeth: but I go, that I may awake him out of sleep. 12 Then said his disciples, Lord, if he sleep, he shall do well. 13 Howbeit Jesus spake of his death: but they thought that he had spoken of taking rest in sleep. 14 Then said Jesus unto them plainly, Lazarus is dead. Thus, Jesus believed and taught that "death" is like sleep, which agrees with the **Bible** as we have just seen. If we are going to "follow Jesus", then it is clear that we must believe that "death" is like "sleep"! Now, we can see the "connection" between the man saying he would "follow Jesus", and the Lords answer of "not where to lay his head", or as we would say,

"no place to sleep".

Jesus was telling the man:

Paraphrase:

If you want to **Physically** "follow me" I must tell you that I have no "place" for Physical "sleep".

If you want to Spiritually "follow me" I must tell you that I have no "place" (heaven or hell) for Spr. "sleep" (death). Thus, Jesus is in perfect agreement with the Bible that when we die we don't "go" any "place", we simply "wait in the grave", as Job says. (Job 17:13)

As we have seen, in the first part of this parable, Jesus is teaching about Physical death and what happens to a person when they Physically die.

Now let's look at the second part of the parable.

Matthew 8:21-22

21 And another of his disciples said unto him, Lord, suffer me first to go and bury my father.

22 But Jesus said unto him, Follow me; and let the dead bury their dead.

In the second part of this parable a man wants to bury his Physically dead father, before he is willing to "follow Jesus". Jesus said to him "Follow me and let the dead bury their dead".

Since it is impossible for a Physically dead person to bury another Physically dead person, then the only possible explanation for the answer that Jesus gave, is that Jesus was trying to turn the man's attention from Physical death to Spiritual death.

To Paraphrase the words of Jesus:

Follow me and let those that are Spiritually dead, bury those that are Physically dead.

We have just discovered what **Jesus** and the **Bible** say that Physical death is like. Now we need to discover what the Bible says about a person that is Spiritually dead. In order to do this we will again use a Concordance and look up the word "dead", but this time we are looking for the **Spiritual** meaning of the word. I Timothy 5:6 But she that liveth in pleasure is dead while she liveth. (When a person is living in sin, they are considered "dead" by God.) Luke 15:10,21-24 10 Likewise, I say unto you, there is joy in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner that repenteth. 21 And the son said unto him, Father I have sinned against heaven, and in thy sight, and am no more worthy to be called thy son. 22 But the father said to his servants, bring forth the best robe, and put it on him; and put a ring on his hand and shoes on his feet: 23 And bring hither the fatted calf, and kill it; and let us eat, and be merry: 24 For this my son was **dead**, and is **alive** again; he was lost, and is found. And they began to be merry. (When a person "repents" of their sin and returns to God. they are considered "alive" by God.)

II Corinthians 5:14,15,17

14 For the love of Christ constraineth us; because we thus judge, that if one **died** for **all**, then were all **dead**:

15 And that he died for all, that they which live should **not** henceforth live unto themselves, but unto him which died for them, and rose again.

17 Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new.

(Since all have sinned, then we were all Spiritually dead until Jesus died for us. We now have a chance to become Spiritually "alive" if we accept Jesus as our Saviour.)

Ephesians 2:4-5

4 But God, who is rich in mercy, for his great love wherewith he loved us,

5 Even when we were **dead** in sins, hath **quickened** us together with Christ, (by **grace** ye are saved;)

(Through the grace of God we can be made Spiritually "alive" and be saved.)

Colossians 2:12-13

12 **Buried** with him **in baptism**, wherein also ye are **risen** with him through the faith of the operation of God, who hath raised him from the dead.

13 And you being **dead** in your **sins** and the uncircumcision of your flesh, hath he quickened together with him, having **forgiven you** all trespasses;

(We are Spiritually "buried" with Jesus through baptism and our sins are forgiven! Then, we are Spiritually" made "alive" or resurrected with Jesus to begin a new life for Him.)

Thus, a person who is Spiritually "dead" is anyone who has never given their heart to the Lord and been forgiven their sins and made Spiritually "alive". **Conclusion:** Now let us return to the parable to look at it one last time. **Matthew 8:21-22** 21 And another of his disciples said unto him, Lord, suffer me first to go and bury my father. 22 But Jesus said unto him, Follow me; and let the dead bury their dead. Luke 9:59-60 59 And he said unto another, Follow me. But he said, Lord, suffer me first to go and bury my father. 60 Jesus said unto him, Let the dead bury their dead: but go thou and preach the kingdom of God. When we compare the words of Matthew with the words of Luke, we discover Luke adds the words of Jesus to: "Go and **preach** the kingdom of God." Putting this additional piece of information together with what we have already learned, we can give a paraphrase. **Final Paraphrase:** And he said to him "Follow me". But he said, Lord let me first go and bury my father. Then Jesus said to him, Let those who are lost or Spiritually "dead" bury those who are Physically "dead"; but go and preach to those who are Spiritually "dead" so that they can become Spiritually "alive". It's too late for your father because he is Physically "dead" and has no knowledge of anything going on around him, but it's not too late for those who are Spiritually "dead", who are still Physically alive and can still learn the truth that can save them.

Doctrinal Truth (Taught by **Jesus** in the Parable "Let the Dead bury the Dead")

- 1. The Main Theme of this parable is to Follow Jesus.
- 2. The subject of the parable, that suggests that we follow Jesus concerns the <u>condition of a person</u> when they are "dead".
- 3. Since the main theme is to "follow Jesus", the implication is that most people will not "follow Jesus" when it comes to understanding the condition of the dead.
- 4. The Bible clearly states that **Jesus** believed "**death**" to be like "**sleep**". When a person is "**asleep**" they have **no knowledge of anything** that is going on around them.
- 5. The Bible writers agree with Jesus and clearly state that "death" is like "sleep" and that there is "no knowledge, nor wisdom in the grave".
- 6. The Bible says that the "spirit" is simply the "breath" and that the combination of "breath" and "body" make a "living soul".
- 7. The Bible says that "none can keep alive his own soul". It also says that the "soul" that sinneth, it shall die". Thus, the Bible teaches that "souls" are not immortal, but simply living people who can lose the breath of life and die.
- 8. The Bible says that there is **no difference** between the way a "beast" or a "man" dies. They all have "one breath" and all go to the same place, the grave.

- 9. All those that are dead remain in their graves until the resurrection day.
- 10. At the 2nd Coming of Jesus, "those that are **Christ's**" will be resurrected and given the **gift** of **immortality**.
- 11. Besides knowing the condition of man when he is **Physically dead**, Jesus wanted us to know the condition of man when he is **Spiritually dead**.
- 12. When a person is living in sin, they are considered Spiritually dead by God.
- 13. When a person **repents** of their sin and turns to God, through the **grace** of God they are **forgiven**.
- 14. They are Spiritually "buried" with Jesus through baptism and their sins are "washed away" and forgiven.
- 15. Then, they are Spiritually "made alive" by resurrection with Jesus to a New Life for Him.

The Parable of:

The

"Missing Bridegroom"

(Jesus is Coming Back)

The Parable of:

"The Missing Bridegroom" (Matthew 9:14,15)

Matthew 9:14,15

14 Then came to him the disciples of John saying, why do we and the Pharisees fast oft, but **thy** disciples **fast** not?

15 And Jesus said unto them, can the children of the bridechamber mourn, as long as the **bridegroom** is with them? but the days will come, when the **bridegroom** shall be **taken** from them, and then shall they fast.

Comments:

In this parable, Jesus implies that He is the "bridegroom" and his disciples are the "children of the bridechamber". He also said that the "bridegroom" would be "taken" from them and then, "mourning and fasting" would occur. Thus, Jesus was telling them that He would be "taken" from them and then his disciples would "mourn and fast".

Let's see what the **Bible** associates "mourning and fasting" with by comparing Scripture.

Mourn

II Samuel 1:12

12 And they **mourned**, and wept and **fasted** until even, for Saul, and for Jonathan his son, and for the people of the Lord and for the house of Israel; because they were **fallen** by the **sword**.

II Samuel 11:26

26 And when the wife of Uriah heard that Uriah her husband was dead, she mourned for her husband.

(Thus, "mourning and fasting" were associated with someones death.)

Jesus said the bridgroom would be "taken" from them. Let's see what the **Bible** means when it uses the word "taken".

Taken (First meaning)

Acts 8:32,33

32 The place of the Scripture which he read was this, He was led as a sheep to the slaughter; and like a lamb dumb before his shearer, so opened he not his mouth:

33 In his humiliation his judgment was taken away: and who shall declare his generation? for his **life** was **taken** from the earth.

Matthew 24:39

39 And knew not until the flood came and **took** them all away;

(Thus, the Bible uses the word "taken" in the sense of "losing ones life" or being "put to death".)

Taken (Second meaning)

II Kings 2:9,11

9 And it came to pass, when they were gone over, that Elijah said unto Elisha, ask what I shall do for thee, before I be taken away from thee.

11 And it came to pass,...that, behold, there appeared a chariot of fire, and horses of fire...and Elijah went up by a whirlwind into heaven.

Acts 1:11

11 Which also said, ye men of Galilee, why stand ye gazing up into heaven? This same **Jesus**, which is **taken** up from you into heaven, shall **so come** in like manner as ye have seen him go into heaven.

Thus, the Bible uses the word "taken" to also mean "being removed" or "going away", in this case to heaven.

Conclusion: 1

When Jesus said the "bridegroom" would be "taken" from them, He was saying that, He (bridegroom) would be put to death (taken from them) and that then his disciples would "mourn and fast".

Thus, Jesus was predicting His death in this parable!

Conclusion: 2

When Jesus said the "bridegroom" would be "taken" from them, He was also saying that He (bridegroom) would "go away" (be taken) or leave them for awhile as He returned to heaven and this would cause them to be "sad and to fast".

Comments:

Since Jesus implied that **He** was the **bridegroom** in this parable, we need to see what the Bible says about the "**bridegroom**", by comparing Scripture.

Bridegroom

Isaiah 62:5

5 For as a young man marrieth a virgin, so shall thy sons marry thee: and as the **bridegroom** rejoiceth over the **bride**, so shall thy **God** rejoice over **thee**.

John 3:29

He that hath the bride is the bridegroom....

Revelation 19:7

Let us be glad and rejoice, and give honor to him: for the **marriage** of the **Lamb** is come, and **his wife** hath made herself ready.

II Corinthians 11:2

For I am jealous over you with godly jealousy: for I have espoused you to one husband, that I may present you as a chaste virgin to Christ.

(Thus the Bible says that **Jesus Christ is** the **Bridegroom** and the **Church** is the **bride** just as Jesus implied in the parable) 155

By using the word "Bridegroom" in this parable, Jesus was establishing the fact that a "marriage or wedding" was to take place in the future between Himself and His people. Also through the use of the word "Bridegroom", Jesus gives us Hope that He will come again for us.

Matthew 25:6,10

6 And at midnight there was a cry made, Behold the **bridegroom cometh**; go ye out to meet him.

10 And while they went to buy, the bridegroom came; and they that were ready went in with him to the marriage: and the door was shut.

Through the illustration of a wedding or marriage, Jesus shows His Great Love for us and the deep love relationship that we are to have with Him. The word "bridegroom" connects this love with our Hope for Salvation!

Isaiah 61:10

10 I will greatly rejoice in the Lord, my soul shall be joyful in my God; for he hath clothed me with the garments of salvation, he hath covered me with the robe of righteousness, as a bridegroom decketh himself with ornaments, and as a bride adorneth herself with her jewels.



By telling the parable of the **Bridegroom** to be "taken" away, Jesus was able to convey several important truths to His listeners.

- 1. He was able to tell them of His **death** which was soon to take place.
- 2. He was able to show His **love** for them through the marriage relationship of the **Bridegroom** and His **Bride**.
- 3. He was able to tell them that He would have to leave them and return to heaven, but just like a Bridegroom coming for His Bride,
 Jesus would come again for His people.

Comments:

The Bible has clearly shown us that the parable of the "Bridegroom being taken" is associated with the death of Jesus and his leaving or returning to heaven.

The parable thus invites us to learn more about both his death and his "returning" or "coming again".

Since we have already learned about "death" from the parable of "Let the dead bury the dead", we will focus on the "coming again" of Jesus and see what the Bible says about that event.

By using the <u>Concordance</u> we will be able to <u>find texts</u> of <u>Scripture</u> that pertain to the return or second coming of Jesus.

The Bible Concept Of: The Return or Second Coming Of Jesus

Conclusions (Regarding the Second Coming of Jesus)

- 1. Jesus was taken up in the clouds and He will **return** in the clouds in like manner.
- 2. People saw Jesus go into heaven and they will see Him when He returns from heaven.
- 3. Every eye will see Jesus when He comes in the clouds.
- 4. The <u>coming of Jesus</u> will be as **visible** as the lightning from East to West.
- 5. When Jesus comes the wicked will be "taken" in death just like the wicked were "taken" in death by the flood during Noahs time.
- 6. The wicked will be destroyed or "taken" in death by **fire and brimstone from heaven**, just like the wicked were destroyed in Sodom and Gomorrah.
- 7. The bodies or carcasses of the wicked will become food for the birds.
- 8. There will be great **physical changes** to **the earth** when Jesus comes. Every island and mountain will be moved out of place.
- 9. When Jesus comes, not only will we see Him, but we will hear Him shout and we will hear the "trump" or trumpet of God.
- 10. At the Second Coming of Jesus the "dead in Christ" will be "made alive" and caught up together with the living righteous to meet the Lord in the air.
- 11. No one will know the day nor hour when Jesus will come again and so we must always be ready.

Doctrinal Truth (Taught by Jesus in the Parable of "The Missing Bridegroom") 1. Jesus is the Bridegroom and the Church is the Bride.
2. The "missing Bridegroom" represents two different events:
 The death of Jesus which would take Him away from His disciples. The leaving of Jesus for heaven which would take Him away from the Church.
3. By using the illustration of a Bridegroom and Bride , Jesus showed His Great Love for us through the wedding or marriage relationship .
4. The Bridegroom coming for His Bride helps us understand how Jesus will come again for His people.
5. The coming again of Jesus is clearly outlined in the Bible with regard to how He will come and how His coming affects both the righteous and the wicked.
6. Jesus went to heaven in the clouds and He will come again in the clouds.
7. When Jesus left for heaven people saw Him leave and every eye will see Him come again.
8. When Jesus comes again there will be great physical changes to the earth like islands and mountains being moved. (continued on next page) 163

- 9. When Jesus comes again we will hear Him shout and the trumpet of God will sound.
- 10. When Jesus comes again the wicked will be slain or "taken" in death and their bodies will become food for the birds.
- 11. When Jesus comes again the righteous will "remain" or be left alive and the righteous dead will be "made alive" or resurrected.
- 12. When Jesus comes again both the living righteous and the resurrected righteous will be "changed in the twinkling of an eye" and they will be given immortality.
- 13. The living righteous and the resurrected righteous will be "caught up together" and they will "meet the Lord in the air". This clearly shows that Jesus does not set His foot on the earth at His Second Coming.

 Thus, anyone claiming to be Christ and walking on this earth is a false Christ.
- 14. No one will know the **time** when Jesus will come again and so we must always be ready.

The Parable of:

"The Man Without a Wedding Garment"

(How to Pass the Judgment)

The Parable of:

"The Man Without a Wedding Garment" (Matthew 22:1-14)

Matthew 22:1-14 And Jesus answered and spake unto them again by parables, and said,

2 The kingdom of heaven is like unto a certain king, which made a marriage for his son,

3 And <u>sent</u> forth his <u>servants</u> to <u>call them that were bidden</u> to the **wedding**: and they would not come.

4 Again, he <u>sent forth other servants</u>, saying, <u>Tell them</u> which are bidden, Behold, I have prepared my dinner: my oxen and my fatlings are killed, and all things are ready: **come** unto the **marriage**.

5 But they made light of it, and went their ways, one to his farm, another to his merchandise:

6 And the remnant took his servants, and entreated them spitefully, and slew them.

7 But when the **king** heard thereof, he <u>was wroth</u>: and he sent forth his armies, and destroyed those murderers, and burned up their city.

8 Then saith he to his servants, The **wedding** is <u>ready</u>, but they which were bidden were not worthy.

9 Go ye therefore into the highways, and <u>as many as ye shall find</u>, bid to the marriage.

10 So those servants went out into the highways, and gathered together all as many as they found, both bad and good: and the wedding was furnished with guests.

11 And when the king came in to see the guests, he saw there a man which had not on a wedding garment:

12 And he saith unto him, Friend, how camest thou in hither not having a wedding garment? And he was speechless.

13 Then said the **king** to the servants, Bind him hand and foot, and take him away, and cast him into outer darkness; there shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth.

14 For many are <u>called</u>, but few are <u>chosen</u>.

Comments:

The important points in this parable are as follows:

- 1. The main theme is the wedding or marriage of the King's Son.
- 2. An invitation to <u>come to the wedding</u> was given to a <u>first group</u> of people.
- 3. The <u>first group</u> of people <u>rejected</u> the <u>marriage</u> <u>invitation</u>.
- 4. The <u>reason</u> for the <u>rejection</u> of the invitation by the <u>first group</u> of people was that they were only interested in **their own business** (farming, buying, and selling) instead of the **King's business!**
- 5. The King sent his servants a <u>second time</u> to invite the <u>first group</u> of people, but they mistreated and <u>killed</u> the <u>King's servants</u>.
- 6. The <u>King's patience</u> came to an **end** and he rendered **judgment** upon the <u>first group</u> of people for their wicked deeds.
- 7. The King then sent his servants to <u>invite</u> anyone, good or bad, to the wedding.
- 8. After a while, the King **investigated** or inspected those attending the <u>wedding</u> to see what they were **wearing**.
- 9. The King found a man who was **not** wearing a wedding garment.
- 10. The King gave the man an opportunity to explain why, but the man had no answer.
- 11. The King then judged the man as not fit to attend the wedding and had him "cast into outer darkness".
- 12. The <u>final result</u> of the parable is that **many** will be "called" or <u>invited</u> to the <u>wedding</u>, but only a **few** will be **accepted**.

Comparing Scripture:

In order to understand more about this parable, we need to identify the **real objects** and then discover their <u>Spiritual meanings</u> by <u>comparing Scripture</u>.

The real objects are:

- The King
- The Son
- The first servants of the king
- Those <u>first invited</u> to the wedding
- Those <u>later invited</u> to the wedding
- The <u>later servants</u> of the king
- The wedding garment
- The wedding

The King

We know that the Spiritual "King" represents God or the Father.

Psalm 44:4 "Thou art my King, O God..."

The Son

We also know that the Spiritual "Son" represents Jesus.

John 20:31 "But these are written, that ye might believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God; and that believing ye might have life through his name."

The "First Servants" of the King The first Spiritual "servants" represent the prophets that were sent to the people of Israel. Amos 3:7 "Surely the Lord GOD will do nothing, but he revealeth his secret unto his servants the prophets." Those "First Invited" to the Wedding Those that were "first invited" to the wedding were the people of Israel. Matthew 21:43,45 "Therefore say I unto you, The kingdom of God shall be taken from you, and given to a nation bringing forth the fruits thereof. ... And when the chief priests and Pharisees had heard his parables, they perceived that he spake of them." Those "Later Invited" to the Wedding Those that were "later invited" to the wedding were the "Gentiles" or "strangers". Matthew 21:43 "Therefore say I unto you, The kingdom of God shall be taken from you [Israel], and given to a nation bringing forth the fruits thereof." 1 Peter 2:9,10 "But ye are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, an holy nation... Which in time past were **not** a **people**, but are **now** the <u>people of God</u>..." Romans 9:24,25 "Even us, whom he hath called, not of the Jews only, but also of the **Gentiles**? As he saith ... I will call them my people, which were not my people..."

The "Later Servants" of the King
The later Spiritual "servants" represent the apostles and teachers sent to the "Gentiles".

1 Peter 1:1 "Peter, an apostle of Jesus Christ, to the strangers scattered throughout..."

2 Timothy 2:2 "And the things that thou hast heard of me [Apostle Paul] among many witnesses, the same commit thou to faithful men, who shall be able to **teach** others also."

The Wedding Garment

The Spiritual "Wedding Garment" represents the "garment of <u>Salvation</u>" or the robe of <u>Christ's Righteousness</u>.

Isaiah 61:10 "I will greatly rejoice in the <u>LORD</u>... for <u>he</u> hath clothed me with the garments of salvation, he hath <u>covered me</u> with the robe of righteousness, as a bridegroom..."

	The Wedding The Spiritual "Wedding" or "Marriage" represents the Judgment.
	Job 29:14 "I put on righteousness, and it clothed me: my judgment was as a robe and a diadem."
	The above text clearly shows the <u>relationship</u> of the "robe of <u>righteousness</u> " or the "wedding garment" to the judgment. The " <u>robe</u> " or " <u>wedding garment</u> " was <u>directly connected</u> to being judged!
	The man in the parable without the "robe" or "wedding garment" could not pass the judgment and was "taken away and cast into outer darkness".
	Psalm 35:24 "Judge me, O Lord, according to thy righteousness."
	Without the covering "robe of Christ's Righteousness", no one can pass the judgment of God!

Comments:

Before we are ready to write a <u>Spiritual paraphrase</u> of the parable, we need to think about what is happening at a "wedding" or "marriage".


A wedding or marriage takes place when a <u>man</u> and <u>woman</u> who have had a <u>relationship together decide</u> that they want to "live together" <u>forever!</u>

Similarly, a spiritual "wedding" or spiritual "marriage" takes place when a spiritual "Man" (Jesus) and a spiritual "woman" (the Church) decide that they want to "live together" forever!

The "Judgment" seals their <u>commitment</u> to each other <u>forever</u>, just as a "marriage" does!
That is why the "wedding" or "marriage" represents the Judgment.

Sometimes, even after a <u>long relationship</u>, a man and woman decide that they do **not** want to get **married** or have a "**wedding**", because they do not want to "live **together**" <u>forever</u>. Sometimes a <u>woman</u> will **reject** a man's <u>proposal of marriage</u>. The Bible says that the <u>Lord</u> is the "<u>husband</u>" and the "<u>woman</u>" represents **God's people**.

Isaiah 54:5,6 "For thy Maker is thine <u>husband</u>; the <u>LORD</u> of hosts is his name... For the <u>LORD</u> hath called <u>thee</u> as a <u>woman</u>... and a <u>wife</u>..."



The parable of the "Man Without a Wedding Garment" clearly shows the <u>absolute necessity</u> of being "clothed" with Christ's righteousness in order to be saved! Now, we are ready to write a <u>Spiritual paraphrase</u> of the parable.

Paraphrase (Spiritual):

God (the king) wanted Jesus (His Son) to be able to live together forever (make a marriage) with His people (the bride or woman). He sent prophets (His servants) to invite Israel (first group invited) to accept His Son Jesus, but they rejected Him. God (the King) then sent more prophets (his servants) to tell them that it was time (all things were ready) for the Judgment (marriage) to take place, but they were too busy with their own business (farming, buying, selling) to be concerned. The prophets (servants) were mistreated and killed (slew them) by Israel. Finally, God's patience and forgiveness was at an end (he was wroth)! He judged the nation of Israel as "not worthy" and sent the Roman army (sent forth his armies) under Titus in A.D. 70 to "burn up the city" of Jerusalem and to "destroy those murderers".

Then God (the king) made the decision to invite the Gentiles (anyone, good and bad) to come and "live together" with His Son forever (be married). After a while, God (the king) began to investigate (came in to see) what those who had come to "live with His Son forever" (come to the wedding) were wearing. God (the king) saw a man who was not clothed with the Robe of Christ's righteousness (wedding garment). The man was instead clothed in filthy rags (his own righteousness – Zech. 3:1-5, Isa. 64:6). The man had no reason for not having the robe of Christ's righteousness on (wedding garment) and so God judged the man as lost (take him away and cast him into outer darkness)! Many people are invited (called) to live forever with Jesus (marry Him), but only a few will actually "marry Him" (pass the judgment).

Doctrinal Truth (Taught by **Jesus** in the Parable of "The Man Without a Wedding Garment")

- 1. The "wedding" or "marriage" represents the **Judgment**.
- 2. Before a man and woman get (physically) married, they have developed a relationship to the point of wanting to "live together" forever! Similarly, the Judgment represented by the "marriage" or "wedding" occurs when the Lord as the (spiritual) Bridegroom and God's people as the (spiritual) bride, have developed their relationship to the point that they both want to "live together" forever.
- 3. Sometimes in a (physical) <u>relationship</u> a <u>man</u> and <u>woman</u> decide that they do **not** want to get <u>married</u> and "<u>live together forever</u>". The woman will **reject** the "invitation" or **proposal** of marriage by the <u>man</u>. Similarly, sometimes in a (spiritual) <u>relationship</u> between the **Lord** (man) and His **people** (woman), <u>individuals</u> or even <u>nations</u> will **reject** the "invitation" or <u>proposal</u> of marriage by the Lord.
- 4. When an "invitation" or proposal of marriage is made and then rejected, it causes a permanent separation to occur between a man and woman. Similarly, when an "invitation" or proposal of marriage is made by the Lord (man) and then rejected by one of His people (woman), it causes a permanent separation to occur between the Lord (man) and that person (woman). The "marriage" or judgment will permanently decide the destiny or future of every individual.

- 5. Those who **accept** the "invitation" by the Lord to "marry Him" will live forever with Him!
- 6. Those who **reject** the "invitation" by the Lord and **refuse** to "marry Him" will be <u>lost forever!</u>
- 7. God has "invited" **everyone** to the "marriage" of His Son. Whether you are "good" or "bad" doesn't matter; you are <u>still invited</u> to become His "<u>bride</u>"!
- 8. We are to "come to the marriage" just as we are (bad or good). Even the "best garment" that we could provide for ourselves will not be "good enough" for us to attend the "wedding".
- 9. The "garment" that we could provide for ourselves represents our "works". Our works are like filthy garments or "filthy rags"!
- 10. The "garment" that we need is the special "wedding garment" that is provided at the marriage. Only the "wedding garment" will make us acceptable at the wedding!
- 11. The "wedding garment" represents the righteous life of Jesus! Another name for the "wedding garment" is the "Robe of righteousness" or the "Garment of Salvation".
- 12.If we <u>choose</u> to attend the "marriage" without the "wedding garment", we can expect to be "cast out" and rejected at the time of the "marriage".

 Similarly, if we <u>choose</u> to be judged by our own "works" or <u>sinful lives</u>, we can expect to be "cast out" and rejected and <u>lost</u> at time of the judgment!

- 13.If we <u>choose</u> to attend the "marriage" and **accept** the "wedding garment" or the "robe of <u>Christ's</u> righteousness" or the <u>righteous life</u> of Christ in place of our sinful life, we can expect to be **accepted** or <u>saved</u> at the time of the Judgment!
- 14. From our study of the <u>parable</u> of the "garment with the Hole in it" we learned that accepting the "new garment" or, as it is called in this parable, the "wedding garment", means being willing to give up sin and to allow the <u>Holy Spirit</u> to change us and make us <u>like Jesus</u>. While we are "becoming like Jesus" and are not perfect, we are "covered" by Christ's robe of righteousness (wedding garment) and as far as the judgment (marriage) is concerned, we are considered by <u>God</u> (the King) to be perfect and therefore are accepted by Him.
- 15. Without the "covering" of the wedding garment the man in the parable had no hope of being accepted at the wedding.
- 16. Without the "covering" righteousness of Christ, we have no hope of passing the Judgment!

Final Conclusion:

As we have examined the Parables of Jesus, letting the "Bible explain itself" by comparing the Scriptures, the Doctrines and Teachings of Jesus have become plain to us. As we might have suspected, given the repeated warnings of Jesus to "beware of false teachers", the Doctrines of Jesus as taught by the Parables are quite different from the doctrines taught by most of the Popular Churches today. When thinking about this difference keep in mind the Parable of The Two Men That Built Houses and what their foundations were; God's Words (rock) or man's words (sand) and you will know what to believe!

In this **first volume** of the parables given in the book of Matthew we have covered 13 parables. There are yet more parables to be covered and we will continue our study of them in "Bible **Parables** Made Simple" **Vol.2**.

May God help you to use the knowledge you have gained from the **Parables** to be like "salt that has **not** lost its Savour".
