### Deviat[e] - ing

To turn aside or wander from the common or right way, course or line, either in a literal or figurative sense; as, to deviate from the common track or path, or from a true course.

To stray from the path of duty; to wander, in a moral sense; to err; to sin.

### Infinite

Without limits; unbounded; boundless; not circumscribed; applied to time, space and qualities. God is infinite in duration, having neither beginning nor end of existence. He is also infinite in presence, or omnipresent, and his perfections are infinite. We also speak of infinite space.

### Omnipotence

L. omnipotens; omnis, all, and potens, powerful

### Presumption

Unreasonable confidence in divine favor.

Blind or headstrong confidence; unreasonable adventurousness; a venturing to undertake something without reasonable prospect of success, or against the usual probabilities of safety; presumptuousness.



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
