Communion

Fellowship; intercourse between two persons or more; interchange of transactions, or offices; a state of giving and receiving; agreement; concord.

Mutual intercourse or union in religious worship, or in doctrine and discipline.

The body of Christians who have one common faith and discipline.

Union of professing Christians in a particular church; as, members in full communion

Consecrate

To make or declare to be sacred, by certain ceremonies or rites; to appropriate to sacred uses; to set apart, dedicate, or devote, to the service and worship of God; as, to consecrate a church.

Perplexities

To make intricate; to involve; to entangle; to make complicated and difficult to be understood or unraveled.

Symmetry

A due proportion of the several parts of a body to each other; adaptation of the dimensions of the several parts of a thing to each other; or the union and conformity of the members of a work to the whole. Symmetry arises from the proportion which the Greeks call analogy, which is the relation of conformity of all the parts to a certain measure; as the symmetry of a building or an animal body.

Uniform symmetry, in architecture, is where the same ordonnance reigns throughout the whole.
