So God's holy day or holiday is the Sabbath. God does not mention any of the modern holidays as being His holy days. This should lead us to the question, "Whose holy days are they?" The truth is these are the same days and the same traditions that the ancient people kept in honor of the pagan gods. The only reason they are kept today is because the early backsliding Christians mixed Christianity with Paganism in order to be more popular among

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of the True God's son, Jesus Christ. But December 25 falls directly in the middle of the winter and even in Israel it would have been too cold for sheep and shepherds to be out in the fields. This can be seen in the fact that Christ said: *But pray ye that your flight be not in the winter...* (Matthew 24:20).

It appears that some of the Christmas traditions resemble strongly ancient idolatrous traditions that went on in Bible times.

Jeremiah 10:2-4 *Thus saith the LORD, Learn not the way of the heathen, and be not dismayed at*

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Mother, and Child god. The Father was Nimrod, who after his death, was said to have ascended to the sun to become the sun-god. The Mother, his wife, Semiramis, was represented as the Moon-goddess, or Earth-goddess. And the Son, Tammuz, was also represented by the Sun. To each the people dedicated various days in their honor.

These days called holy days are the origin of the modern word holidays. According to ***Webster's Dictionary***, The word Holiday comes from a Middle English word which comes from the Old English word *Haligdaeg* made from two

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done a long time ago, people today celebrate those days unaware of their origin. Despite the sincere beliefs of many people, that these days are in honor of Jesus Christ, it does not change the origin of these days, nor God's opinion of false worship. Notice that in the story found in Exodus 32 when the Israelites worshipped the golden calf, it was proclaimed a feast to the Lord, nevertheless, this did not turn aside God's wrath.

Exodus 20:8 *Remember the sabbath day, to keep it holy.*
Isaiah 58:13 *If thou turn away thy foot from the sabbath, from doing thy pleasure on my holy day; and call the sabbath a delight, the holy of the LORD, honourable; and shalt honour him, not doing thine*

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Halloween-Worship of Death

October 31st is a day of the works of darkness. No truly intelligent being could say this holiday is a day of lovely things (Philippians 4:8).

But is this day, known as the day of the dead, worship of Jesus Christ? The Bible tells us,
Luke 20:38 *For he is not a God of the dead, but of the living: for all live unto him.*

The true God is not the god of the dead. Worship of the dead is part of Paganism not Christianity. When the Israelites backslid at Baal-peor, it is written;

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Learn to do Well

Isaiah 1:16,17 *... cease to do evil... Learn to do well...*

The Origin of Paganism

Not too long after the flood, the world united at the Tower of Babel, in rebellion against God. (Gen. 11) This rebellion was dispersed when the people were scattered over the earth. Thus all the pagan religions came from the paganism at Babel. The pagan Babel or Babylonian worship consisted in a worship of a Father,

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the heathens. Paul gave a warning to the Galatians about this.

Galatians 4:8-11 *Howbeit then, when ye knew not God, ye did service unto them which by nature are no gods. But now, after that ye have known God, or rather are known of God, how turn ye again to the weak and beggarly elements, whereunto ye desire again to be in bondage? Ye observe days, and months, and times, and years. I am afraid of you, lest I have bestowed upon you labour in vain.*

The Galatians were returning to their heathen ways by celebrating the days of their former idols. Unfortunately, because this was

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Mark 2:28 *Therefore the Son of man is Lord also of the sabbath.*

Luke 4:16 *And he came to Nazareth, where he had been brought up: and, as his custom was, he went into the synagogue on the sabbath day, and stood up for to read.*

Let us in all we do "Fear God and give glory to him..."(Rev.14:7)
